If the Division has cause to believe that a driving log has been falsified, the limited learner's permit holder shall be required to complete a new driving log with the same requirements and shall not be eligible to obtain a limited provisional license for six months.

SECTION 2.1.(a) The Division of Motor Vehicles shall utilize third-party vendors to administer the road tests required by Article 2 of Chapter 20 pursuant to all of the following:

- Each vendor shall obtain a certification from the Division that the road test (1) administered by the vendor complies with criteria and training developed by the Division.
- (2) A vendor may charge a fee for a road test, as agreed upon by the Division and the vendor. This fee shall be the only fee charged to the person for the road test. Any fee charged to a person for a road test by a private vendor shall be deducted from the fee charged by the Division under Article 2 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes for issuance of the license for which the applicant is required to take the road test.
- The Division shall maintain oversight of the road tests conducted by vendors. (3) **SECTION 2.1.(b)** No later than November 1, 2021, the Division shall report to the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee on the overall implementation of this section the number of vendors utilized by the Division; the training and criteria used by the Division for the certification of a vendor; the fees charged by vendors for a road test, if road test wait times were reduced; and the effect on customer service within the Division.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
