2	AN ACT TO PERMIT INCREASED ACCESS TO INDOOR AND OUTDOOR FACILITIES			
3	IN CERTAIN COUNTIES FOR GRADUATION OR COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES			
4	IN PUBLIC AND NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS, AND TO CERTAIN LOCAL SCHOOL			
5	ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS TO ALIGN THE SCHOOL CALENDARS OF THOSE			
6	UNITS WITH LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES.			
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
8	SECTION 1.(a) Notwithstanding Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the General			
9 10	Statutes, any executive order, secretarial order, or directive authorized pursuant to Article 1A of Chapter 166A of the General Statutes, or any other provision of law, the governing board of a			
11	public or nonpublic school shall, in consultation with the local health department, establish the			
12	number of individuals who are permitted to attend graduation or commencement ceremonies held			
13	for the 2020-2021 school year. In no event may the number of individuals in attendance exceed			
14	the occupancy or fire capacity of the venue where the graduation or commencement ceremonies			
15	are held.			
16	SECTION 1.(b) This section is effective when it becomes law.			
17	SECTION 2.(a) G.S. 115C-84.2(d) reads as rewritten:			
18	"(d) Opening and Closing Dates. – Local boards of education shall determine the dates of			
19	opening and closing the public schools under subdivision (a)(1) of this section.section in			
20	accordance with the following requirements:			
21	(1) Except for year round schools, the <u>The</u> opening date for students shall be no			
22	earlier than the Monday closest to August 26, and the closing date for students			
23	shall be no later than the Friday closest to June 11. June 11, except in the			
24	following circumstances:			
25	a. The school's calendar is aligned so that it is no earlier than the opening			
26	date of a community college serving the county in which the school			
27	unit is located, in whole or in part.			
28	b. The school is a year-round school.			
29	c. The school had a modified calendar for the 2003-2004 school year or			
30	was part of a planned program in the 2003-2004 school year for a			
31	system of modified calendar schools, so long as the school operates

33 24	(2) On a showing of good cause, the State Board of Education may waive the			
34 35	requirement that the opening date for students be no earlier than the Monday			
35 36	closest to August 26 and may allow the local board of education to set an opening data no opening than the Monday closest to August 10 to the extent

17	SECTION 3. This act applies only to Rockingham County, Stokes County	, and Surry
