Short Title: Criminal Sentence Reduction Reform. (Public) Representative Alston. Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO IMPLEMENT CRIMINAL SENTENCE REDUCTION REFORM. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Article 83 of Chapter 15A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 15A-1357. Modification of an imposed term of imprisonment. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individual serving a term of imprisonment pursuant to G.S. 20-179 or Article 81B or 82 of this Chapter, except those sentenced to life imprisonment, may file a motion for appropriate relief in accordance with Article 89 of Chapter 15A of the General Statutes for a modification of the person's sentence pursuant to the authority granted in this section. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the court shall reduce a term of imprisonment imposed upon a defendant for an offense if: The defendant was sentenced pursuant to G.S. 20-179 or Article 81B or 82 of (1) this Chapter and has served at least five years in prison. (2) The court finds, after considering the factors set forth in subsection (c) of this section, that the defendant is not a danger to the safety of any person or the community and that the interests of justice warrant a sentence modification. (c) The court, in determining whether to reduce a term of imprisonment pursuant to subsection (c) of this section, shall consider: The defendant's age at the time of the offense. (1) (2) The history and characteristics of the defendant. Whether the defendant has substantially complied with the rules of the (3) institution to which he or she has been confined and whether the defendant has completed any educational, vocational, or other program, where available. Whether the defendant has completed any behavioral health treatment or (4) stabilization. Any report or recommendation received from the district attorney in the (5) prosecutorial district in which the conviction was entered. Whether the defendant has demonstrated maturity, rehabilitation, and a fitness <u>(6)</u> to reenter society sufficient to justify a sentence reduction. Any statement provided orally or in writing pursuant to G.S. 15A-832.1(c) by <u>(7)</u> a victim of the offense for which the defendant is imprisoned or by a family member of the victim if the victim is deceased. Any reports of physical, mental, or psychiatric examinations of the defendant (8)



conducted by licensed health care professionals.
