7	SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-1413 reads as rewritten:		
8	"§ 143B-1413. Limitation of liability.		
9	(a)		pt in cases of wanton or willful misconduct, a communications service provider,
10	and a 911 system provider or provider, next generation 911 system provider, PSAP, regional		
11	<u>PSAP</u> , and their employees, directors, officers, vendors, and agents are not liable for any damages		
12	in a civil action resulting from death or injury to any person or from damage to property incurred		
13	by any person in connection with developing, adopting, implementing, maintaining, or operating		
14	the 911 system system, including call taking, dispatching, radio operations, data terminal		
15	operations, or any combination of these call taking functions in a PSAP, or in complying with		
16	emergency-related information requests from State or local government officials. This section		
17	does not apply to actions arising out of the operation or ownership of a motor vehicle. vehicle by		
18	an employee or agent of a 911 system provider, next generation 911 system provider, PSAP, or		
19	regional PSAP. The acts and omissions described in this section include, but are not limited to,		
20	the follow	ving:	
21		(1)	The release of subscriber information related to emergency calls or emergency
22		. ,	services.
23		(2)	The use or provision of 911 service, E911 service, or next generation 911
24			service.
25		(3)	Other matters related to 911 service, E911 service, or next generation 911
26			service.
27		(4)	Text-to-911 service.
28	(b)	In an	y civil action by a user of 911 services or next generation 911 services arising
29	from an act or an omission by a PSAP, and the officers, directors, employees, vendors, agents,		
30	and authorizing government entity of the PSAP, in the performance of any lawful and prescribed		
31	actions pertaining to their assigned job duties as a telecommunicator. The telecommunicator, the		
32	plaintiff's burden of proof shall be by clear and convincing evidence."		
33	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to causes of		
34	action file	ed on or	r after that date.
