1 shall be construed to require the digital reproduction or posting of copies of 2 the instructional materials themselves. 3 Any procedures for the documentation, review, or approval of the lesson **(2)** 4 plans, including instructional materials identified in those plans, by the 5 principal, curriculum administrators, or other teachers. 6 The procedure established by the governing board for requesting an in-person <u>(3)</u> 7 review of an instructional material not publicly available on the internet. 8 The governing body shall provide access from the website of the public school unit 9 to the information required by subsection (b) of this section by June 30 of each year either through 10 a website maintained by the public school unit or by a link to another website where the information is publicly accessible. Public access to the information for the school year ending 11 June 30 shall be maintained by the public school unit until June 30 of the following year. The 12 Department of Public Instruction shall make available to public school units one or more 13 14 templates for providing information as required by this section. A public school unit may exercise 15 flexibility in determining the most effective means of compliance with the requirements of this section, including, but not limited to, utilizing any of the following in its discretion: 16 17 Providing a template created by the Department of Public Instruction to (1) 18 teachers to facilitate reporting of lesson plans. 19 Creating one or more templates to provide to teachers to facilitate reporting of (2) 20 lesson plans. The public school unit may customize templates for grades or 21 courses and may autopopulate any instructional materials required by the public school unit as part of the curriculum for a particular grade or course. 22 Allowing utilization of online collaborative software, documents, or 23 <u>(3)</u> 24 spreadsheets to allow multiple authorized users to update content. 25 Authorizing updating lesson plans throughout the school year, if all updates (4) 26 are completed by June 30. 27 A governing body that is responsible for the operation of schools with fewer than 400 (d) 28 students cumulatively is not required to comply with the requirements of this section." 29 **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-12 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 30 "(9e) Duty to Inform the Public About Instructional Materials. – The Board shall ensure that information about instructional materials for any school operated 31 32 under Article 7A and Article 9C of this Chapter is prominently displayed on 33 the website of the school, as required by G.S. 115C-102.1." 34 **SECTION 3.** G.S. 115C-47 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 35 "(58a) To Inform the Public About Instructional Materials. - Local boards of 36 education shall ensure that information about instructional materials for each 37 school in the local school administrative unit is prominently displayed on the website of the school, as required by G.S. 115C-102.1." 38 39 **SECTION 4.** G.S. 115C-238.66 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: 40 "(11a) Instructional materials. – The board of directors shall ensure that information 41 about instructional materials is prominently displayed on the website of the 42 regional school, in accordance with G.S. 115C-102.1." 43 **SECTION 5** G.S. 115C-218.85 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 44 Instructional Materials. - A charter school shall ensure that information about 45 instructional materials is prominently displayed on the website of the charter school, in

**SECTION 6.** Article 4 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:

"§ 116-69.2. Inform the public about instructional materials.

accordance with G.S. 115C-102.1."

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The Board of Trustees shall ensure that information about instructional materials is prominently displayed on the website of the North Carolina School of the Arts for all elementary, middle, and high school programs, in accordance with G.S. 115C-102.1."

SECTION 7. G.S. 116-235 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

"(j) Instructional Materials. – The Board of Trustees shall ensure that information about

**SECTION 8.** G.S. 116-239.8(b) reads as rewritten:

- "(b) The chancellor shall be the administrative head of a laboratory school approved by the Subcommittee and shall provide general direction for the establishment and operation of a laboratory school. The chancellor, with advice and input from the advisory board established in subdivision (1) of this subsection, shall adopt policies, operating procedures, and the courses of study to govern the operation of the laboratory school. The chancellor may designate the duties required by this Article to other personnel as necessary. The chancellor shall also have the following powers and duties:
  - (2a) <u>Instructional materials. The chancellor shall ensure that information about instructional materials is prominently displayed on the website of the laboratory school, in accordance with G.S. 115C-102.1.</u>
- **SECTION 9.** Section 6(d) of S.L. 2018-32 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:
- "(5a) G.S. 115C-102.1, Inform the public about instructional materials."

  SECTION 10. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the display of instructional materials used during the 2021-2022 school year no later than June 30, 2022.
