- (e) The participation of a pharmacy in a drug benefit provider network of an insurer offering a health benefit plan in this State shall not satisfy any requirement that insurers offering health benefit plans include pharmacists in medical benefit provider networks.
 - <u>(f)</u> This section shall also apply to the following:
 - (1) Agents of an insurer offering a health benefit plan in this State.
 - (2) Third-party administrators, as defined under G.S. 58-56-2."

SECTION 1.(b) This section becomes effective October 1, 2021, and applies to contracts entered into, renewed, or amended on or after that date.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Insurance the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2021-2022 fiscal year to be used by the Department to prepare for implementation of this act.

SECTION 3. Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1, 2021.

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
