1 peer review organizations may include a statewide supervisory committee and various regional 2 and local components or subgroups. The statewide supervisory committee shall consist of 3 representatives from the North Carolina Dental Society, the UNC-University of North Carolina 4 Adams School of Dentistry, the East Carolina University School of Dental Medicine, and the 5 Board. When the statewide supervisory committee considers activities and programs that relate to impaired dental hygienists pursuant to G.S. 90-48.3, its membership shall be expanded to 6 7 include two dental hygienists appointed upon the recommendation of the dental hygienist 8 member of the Board. 9 " 10 SECTION 6. The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners may adopt 11 temporary rules to implement the provisions of this act. SECTION 7. Section 2 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2021, and applies to 12

licenses granted or renewed on or after that date. The remainder of this act is effective when it
becomes law.
