March 23, 2021 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO STAGGER THE TERMS OF THE WINSTON-SALEM/FORSYTH COUNTY 3 BOARD OF EDUCATION AND TO ESTABLISH FOUR-YEAR STAGGERED TERMS 4 WITH ODD-YEAR ELECTIONS FOR THE WAKE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION. 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6 7 PART I. WINSTON-SALEM/FORSYTH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION 8 **SECTION 1.(a)** Section 2(a)(5)(ii) of Chapter 112 of the Session Laws of 1961, as 9 rewritten by Chapter 466 of the Session Laws of 1985, and as amended by Chapter 696 of the 10 Session Laws of 1991, S.L. 2009-72, and S.L. 2011-141, reads as rewritten: Effective on the first Monday in December 1986, the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County 11 "(ii) Board of Education shall be composed of nine members. In the 2010 election, nine persons shall 12 13 be elected to the Winston Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education for members, serving 14 four-year staggered terms. The terms of those elected in 2010 for two-year terms-shall instead 15 expire on the first Monday in December of 2014. December. In 2014:2022, to implement staggering of the terms, all members shall be elected and serve 16 17 as follows: 18 Two persons shall be elected from District 1. The person receiving the highest (1)number of votes shall serve a four-year term, and such seat shall be up for 19 20 election in 2026 and every four years thereafter. The person receiving the second highest number of votes shall serve a two-year term, and such seat 21 22 shall be up for election in 2024 and every four years thereafter. 23 Four persons shall be elected from District 2. The two persons receiving the (2)24 highest and second highest number of votes shall serve a four-year term, and 25 such seats shall be up for election in 2026 and every four years thereafter. The 26 persons receiving the third and fourth highest number of votes shall serve a two-year term, and such seats shall be up for election in 2024 and every four 27 years thereafter. 28 29 (3) Three members shall be elected at large from all of Forsyth County. The 30 persons receiving the highest and second highest number of votes shall serve 31 a four-year term, and such seats shall be up for election in 2026 and every four 32 years thereafter. The person receiving the third highest number of votes shall 33 serve a two-year term, and such seat shall be up for election in 2024 and every four years thereafter. 34 Successors to those elected in 2014 shall serve four-year terms. 35



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For an at-large seat, any qualified voter of Forsyth County is eligible to vote. For the district 1 2 seats, only residents of the district shall be eligible to be candidates and only qualified voters of 3 the district shall be eligible to vote. 4 The districts as established for the purpose of this subparagraph are for the 2010 election those established under G.S. 115C-37(i), which are subject to change for the election in 2014 5 6 after the return of the 2010 census.under G.S. 115C-37(i)." 7 **SECTION 1.(b)** Section 2(a)(5)(i) of Chapter 112 of the Session Laws of 1961 reads 8 as rewritten: 9 The board shall continue to be composed of eight nine persons and the then members "(i) 10 of the board shall continue in office (regardless of the terms for which they were originally appointed) until their successors are elected and qualified, as hereinafter provided." 11 12 **SECTION 1.(c)** This section does not affect the terms of office of any person elected 13 in 2018 to the Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education. Each member of the 14 Winston-Salem/Forsyth County Board of Education elected in 2018, or any member appointed 15 to fill a vacancy for a member elected in 2018, shall serve until a successor has been elected and 16 qualified. 17 18 PART II. WAKE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION 19 SECTION 2.1.(a) Section 7 of Chapter 717 of the Session Laws of 1975, as amended 20 by Chapter 321 of the Session Laws of 1977, as rewritten by Chapter 742 of the Session Laws of 1981, as amended by S.L. 2013-110, and as ordered by Raleigh Wake Citizens Association, et 21 22 al., v. Wake County Board of Elections, et al., Court Order 5:15-CV-00156-D, Document 104, 23 dated August 9, 2016, and Raleigh Wake Citizens Association, et al., v. Wake County Board of 24 Elections, et al., Consent Decree 5:15-CV-00156-D, Document 129, dated December 28, 2017, 25 reads as rewritten: 26 "Sec. 7. (a) Beginning in 2016, nine members of the The Wake County Board of Education 27 shall consist of nine members, elected for staggered terms from nine single-member districts. 28 Members shall be elected by the nonpartisan plurality election method in accordance with 29 G.S. 163-292 and G.S. 163-294.2. Only persons who are registered to vote in the district shall be 30 permitted to file a notice of candidacy for election in that district. Notwithstanding 31 G.S. 163-294.2(c) and G.S. 163-106, candidates seeking office shall file their notices of 32 candidacy with the board of elections no earlier than 12:00 noon on the second Monday in June 33 and no later than 12:00 noon on the first Friday in July (except if that is the 4th day of July then 34 at 12:00 noon on the next business day) preceding the election. Such election shall be governed 35 by the provisions of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes and Statutes. The election in 2022 shall 36 be held to coincide with the general election for county officers in even-numbered years. 37 (b) Beginning in 2016, and quadrennially thereafter, seven members of the board shall 38 be elected from numbered single-member districts to serve a term of four years. The qualified 39 voters of each district shall elect a person who resides in that district for the seat apportioned to 40 that district. Only the qualified voters of the district may vote in that election. In order to implement staggered terms, in 2022, an election shall be held for all nine members of the Wake 41 42 County Board of Education. The Wake County Board of Elections shall certify the total vote 43 count in each of the nine single-member districts. The members in the four districts receiving the four highest total vote counts shall be elected to serve a three-year term. The members from the 44 45 remaining five districts shall be elected to serve a one-year term. 46 (c) In 2016, two members shall be elected from lettered single-member districts to serve 47 a term of two years. In 2018, and quadrennially thereafter, two members shall be elected from 48 lettered single member districts. The qualified voters of each district shall elect a person who 49 resides in that district for the seat apportioned to that district. Only the qualified voters of the

50 district may vote in that election.

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In accordance with G.S. 115C-37(i), following the return of the 2020 census, the 1 (d) 2 Wake County Board of Education shall revise the electoral district boundaries established in 2011 3 by that Board as needed to correct for population imbalances. Those electoral districts shall be 4 used for elections beginning in 2022. The Wake County Board of Elections shall make 5 subsequent revisions to electoral district boundaries in accordance with G.S. 115C-37(i)." 6 **SECTION 2.1.(b)** This section is effective when it becomes law. 7 SECTION 2.2.(a) Section 7(a) of Chapter 717 of the Session Laws of 1975, as 8 amended by Chapter 321 of the Session Laws of 1977, as rewritten by Chapter 742 of the Session 9 Laws of 1981, as amended by S.L. 2013-110, as ordered by Raleigh Wake Citizens Association, 10 et al., v. Wake County Board of Elections, et al., Court Order 5:15-CV-00156-D, Document 104, 11 dated August 9, 2016, and Raleigh Wake Citizens Association, et al., v. Wake County Board of 12 Elections, et al., Consent Decree 5:15-CV-00156-D, Document 129, dated December 28, 2017, 13 and as amended by Section 2.1 of this act, reads as rewritten: 14 "(a) The Wake County Board of Education shall consist of nine members, elected for four-year staggered terms from nine single-member districts. Members shall be elected by the 15 nonpartisan plurality election method in accordance with G.S. 163-292 and G.S. 163-294.2. Such 16 17 election shall be governed by the provisions of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The election 18 in 2022 Statutes and shall be held to coincide with the general election for county officers in 19 even-numbered years.on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November in each odd-numbered 20 year as terms expire." 21 **SECTION 2.2.(b)** This section becomes effective December 4, 2023, and elections 22 in 2023 shall be held accordingly. 23 SECTION 2.3. Sections 2.1 and 2.2 of this act do not affect the terms of office of 24 any person elected in 2020 to the Wake County Board of Education. Each member of the Wake 25 County Board of Education elected in 2020, or any member appointed to fill a vacancy for a 26 member elected in 2020, shall serve until a successor has been elected and qualified. 27 SECTION 2.4. Section 5 of S.L. 2013-110 is repealed. 28 29 PART III. EFFECTIVE DATE 30 **SECTION 3.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes 31 law.

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
