A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT PROHIBITING MEMBERSHIP WAITING PERIODS FOR ELIGIBL EMPLOYEES UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND UPDATING THE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT FUNDATCHING REQUIREMENTS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. employees who are otherwise eligible to become members of the Retireme System."
SECTION 2. G.S. 58-87-1 reads as rewritten: "Article 87. "Volunteer Safety Workers Assistance.
"§ 58-87-1. Volunteer Fire Department Fund. (a) Fund. – The Volunteer Fire Department Fund is created as an interest-bearin nonreverting fund in the Department to provide matching grants to volunteer fire departments purchase equipment and make capital improvements. The Commissioner shall administer the Fund. Up to one percent (1%) of the Fund may be used for additional staff and resources administer the Fund in each fiscal year.
(a1) Grant Program. – An eligible fire department may apply to the Commissioner for grant under this section. In awarding grants under this section, the Commissioner must, to the extent possible, select applicants from all parts of the State based upon need. The Commission must award the grants on May 15, or on the first business day after May 15 if May 15 falls on weekend or a holiday, of each year subject to the following limitations:
 (1) The size of a grant may not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). (2) The applicant shall match the grant on a dollar for dollar basis, unless the applicant receives less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) per year from municipal and county funding, in which case the applicant shall match or dollar (\$1.00) for each three dollars (\$3.00) of grant funds.
(2a) The applicant shall match the grant as follows: a. Applicants receiving less than or equal to fifty thousand dolla (\$50,000) per year from municipal and county funding are not require to match the grant funding.



- within 60 days after the grants have been made. This report must contain the following:
 - (1) The amount of the grant and the name of the recipient.
 - (2) The Fund balance at the beginning of the grant cycle.
 - (3) Cash receipts through the previous grant cycle.

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- Cash disbursements through the previous grant cycle. (4)
- (5) The Fund balance at the beginning and end of the previous grant cycle.
- Any funding on deposit with the State Treasury for the purposes defined herein is (d) appropriated up to the amount needed to reimburse volunteer fire departments for grants awarded during the most recent grant cycle."

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2021.

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
