Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF DURHAM TO EMPLOY AND ALLOW CIVILIAN PERSONNEL TO INVESTIGATE TRAFFIC CRASHES INVOLVING ONLY PROPERTY DAMAGE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Chapter VII of the Charter of the City of Durham, being Chapter 671 of the 1975 Session Laws, as amended, is amended by adding a new section to read as follows: "Sec. 128. Civilian Traffic Investigators. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the City may employ and allow civilian personnel to investigate traffic crashes. The civilian personnel shall be known as "Civilian Traffic Investigators." All of the following shall apply to Civilian Traffic Investigators (hereinafter "Investigator" or "Investigators") employed by the City: The City shall establish the minimum standards for employment as an <u>(1)</u> Investigator. Each Investigator shall attend a training program designed by the City of **(2)** Durham Police Department in consultation with the North Carolina Justice Academy. Upon completion of the training program, each Investigator shall spend not less than four weeks of field training with a law enforcement officer who has experience conducting traffic crash investigations.

Investigators shall be issued a uniform that is substantially different in color

- symbols that identify the vehicle as a police vehicle. The vehicle may have emergency equipment and lights installed but shall not use blue lights in any manner or form. Red and amber lights are permissible.
- (6) Investigators shall not be issued a weapon of any type.
