S	ECTION 1. G.S. 116-143.1 is amended by adding the following new subsections

following qu	alifications shall be eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate:
<u>(</u> 1	The person graduated and received a high school diploma from a school
	within North Carolina or received a high school equivalency diploma within
	North Carolina.
<u>(2</u>	2) The person attended North Carolina schools for a minimum of two
	consecutive years immediately prior to completing high school.
<u>(3</u>	The person is a beneficiary of the federal Deferred Action for Childhood
	Arrivals (DACA) initiative and provides documentation to the constituent
	institution or community college to which the person is enrolled
	demonstrating that the person is a DACA beneficiary.
	The person enrolled in a constituent institution or community college.
	any information obtained as part of the process of applying for in-State tuition
	subsection (n) of this section shall be confidential and is not a public record."
	ECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2022, and applies beginning with
the 2022-202	23 academic year.
