Expanded learning opportunity policy. 21 The State Board of Education shall develop a model policy to expand learning opportunities 22 that allows approved alternative educational opportunities outside of the traditional classroom to 23 24 qualify as elective course credit. Local boards of education shall have the power to adopt local 25 policies based on the model policy provided by the State Board. The model policy shall include at least the following: 26 27 A list of types of entities eligible to submit proposals for alternative (1) 28 educational opportunities that shall qualify as elective course credit. These 29 types of entities include, but are not limited to, the following: 30 Nonprofit organizations. SECTION 3. The State Board shall create the model policy pursuant to Section 2 of this act and make it available to local boards of education by December 15, 2022.

SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year for administrative costs to implement this act.

SECTION 5. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
