Short Title: Revise Motor Vehicle Emission Laws. (Public) Senators Marcus, Garrett, and Mayfield (Primary Sponsors). Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT PROHIBITING MODIFICATIONS ENABLING ILLEGAL EMISSIONS ON DIESEL-POWERED MOTOR VEHICLES, DEFINING AND CRIMINALIZING "COAL ROLLING," AND REQUIRING LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO UNDERGO TRAINING TO DEVELOP THE ABILITY TO PROPERLY IDENTIFY ILLEGAL MOTOR VEHICLE EMISSIONS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 20-128 reads as rewritten: "§ 20-128. Exhaust system and emissions control devices. . . . No person shall modify a diesel-powered motor vehicle with a device that temporarily (e) or permanently enables (i) the vehicle to emit visible air contaminants exceeding the limits of G.S. 20-128.1 or (ii) coal rolling, as defined in G.S. 20-128.1A." **SECTION 1.(b)** G.S. 20-183.3 reads as rewritten: "§ 20-183.3. Scope of safety inspection and emissions inspection. Safety. – A safety inspection of a motor vehicle consists of an inspection of the following equipment to determine if the vehicle has the equipment required by Part 9 of Article 3 of this Chapter and if the equipment is in a safe operating condition: (9) Exhaust system and emissions control devices, as required by G.S. 20-128. For diesel-powered motor vehicles, this inspection shall include a determination that the vehicle has not been modified in violation of G.S. 20-128(e). For a vehicle that is subject to an emissions inspection in addition to a safety inspection, a visual inspection of the vehicle's emissions control devices is included in the emissions inspection rather than the safety inspection." **SECTION 1.(c)** This section becomes effective October 1, 2022, and applies to vehicles inspected or due to be inspected on or after that date. **SECTION 2.(a)** Article 3 of Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 20-128.1A. Coal rolling.

Powers and duties of the Commission. 24 The Commission shall have the following powers, duties, and responsibilities, which 25 are enforceable through its rules and regulations, certification procedures, or the provisions of 26 G.S. 17E-8 and G.S. 17E-9: 27 28 (11)Establish minimum standards for in-service training for justice officers. 29 In-service training standards for sworn law enforcement officers shall include 30 all of the following training topics: 31 . . . 32 Training to develop the ability to properly identify violations of į. 33 G.S. 20-128.1 and G.S. 20-128.1A. The standards established under 34 this subdivision shall require eight hours of training each year. 35 36 **SECTION 3.(c)** This section becomes effective January 1, 2023, and applies to 37 applications for law enforcement certification filed on or after that date. 38 **SECTION 4.(a)** There is appropriated from the Highway Fund to the Department of 39 Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) 40 in nonrecurring funds for the 2022-2023 fiscal year to be used to (i) implement the emission inspections standards enacted by Section 3 of this act and (ii) educate the public regarding the 41 42 effects of this act. 43 **SECTION 4.(b)** This section becomes effective July 1, 2022. 44 **SECTION 5.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes 45 law.
