11 **SECTION 7.** The Speaker of the House of Representatives or the President Pro
12 Tempore of the Senate may authorize appropriate committees or subcommittees of their
13 respective houses to meet during the interims between sessions to (i) review matters related to
14 the State budget for the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, (ii) prepare reports, including revised
15 budgets, or (iii) consider any other matters as the Speaker of the House of Representatives or the
16 President Pro Tempore of the Senate deems appropriate.

17 **SECTION 8.** This resolution is effective upon ratification.
