5	DONATIONS, AND TO PROVIDE UP TO THIRTY DAYS' PAID LEAVE TO STATE

7	LIVING ORGAN DONORS AND UP TO SEVEN DAYS' PAID LEAVE FOR BONE

9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

11	PART I. INSURANCE PROTECTIONS
12	SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 58-3-25 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
13	"(d) No insurer shall refuse to insure or to continue to insure an individual; limit the
14	amount, extent, or kind of coverage available to an individual; charge an individual a different
15	amount for the same coverage; or otherwise discriminate against an individual in the offering,
16	issuance, cancellation, price, or conditions of a policy, or in the amount of coverage provided
17	under a policy, based solely and without any additional actuarial risks on the status of an
18	individual as a living organ donor. This subsection shall apply to health benefit plans and life,
19	accident and health, accident, disability, disability income, and long-term care insurance policies.
20	For the purposes of this subsection, the phrase "a living organ donor" shall mean a living
21	individual who donates one or more of that individual's human organs, including bone marrow,
22	to be medically transplanted into the body of another individual."
23	SECTION 1.(b) G.S. 131E-294(4) reads as rewritten:
24	"(4) Antidiscrimination (G.S. 58-3-25(b) and (c), (G.S. 58-3-25, 58-3-120,
25	58-63-15(7), and 58-67-75);"
26	SECTION 1.(c) This section is effective 30 days after it becomes law and applies to
27	insurance contracts issued, renewed, or amended on or after that date.
