AN ACT PROHIBITING THE COMMISSION FOR PUBLIC HEALTH, STATE AND LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH AGENCIES, AND STATE AND LOCAL PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICIALS FROM REQUIRING NORTH CAROLINA STUDENTS TO BE IMMUNIZED AGAINST CORONAVIRUS DISEASE (COVID-19).

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**SECTION 1.** G.S. 130A-152 reads as rewritten:

## "§ 130A-152. Immunization required.

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- (a) Every child present in this State shall be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough, poliomyelitis, red measles (rubeola) and rubella. In addition, except as otherwise provided in G.S. 130A-152.1, every child present in this State shall be immunized against any other disease upon a determination by the Commission that the immunization is in the interest of the public health.
- (a1) Every parent, guardian, person in loco parentis and person or agency, whether governmental or private, with legal custody of a child shall have the responsibility to ensure is responsible for ensuring that the child has received the required immunization each immunization required by this section at the age required specified by the Commission. If a child has not received the a required immunizations immunization by the specified age, the responsible person shall obtain the required immunization for the child as soon as possible after the lack of the required immunization is determined.

- (c) The Commission shall adopt and the Department shall enforce rules concerning the implementation of the <u>an</u> immunization <u>program. program that meets the requirements of this</u> Part. The rules shall <del>provide for:</del>delineate all of the following:
  - (1) The child's age at administration of each vaccine; vaccine.
  - (2) The number of doses of each vaccine; vaccine.
  - (3) Exemptions from the immunization requirements where medical practice suggests that immunization would not be in the best health interests of a specific category of <a href="mailto:ehildren;children">ehildren;children</a>.
  - (4) The procedures and practices for administering the vaccine; and vaccine.
- (5) Redistribution of vaccines provided to local health departments.
  - (6) Reasonable fees health care providers may charge for the administration of vaccines provided by the State, in accordance with subsection (b) of G.S. 130A-433.

Notwithstanding any provision of this Part or Chapter 166A of the General Statutes, the Commission, State and local public health agencies, and State and local public health officials are prohibited from requiring that any child or student present in this State be immunized against coronavirus disease (COVID-19) for any reason."

**SECTION 3.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to new vaccine requirements established for children in this State on or after that date.

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
