1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
2 AN ACT TO DIRECT THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO DEVELOP A  
3 DESIGNATION FOR DRIVERS LICENSES THAT MAY BE GRANTED UPON  
4 REQUEST TO A PERSON WITH AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 20-7 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

7 "(q3) Autism Spectrum Disorder Designation. – The Division shall develop, in consultation  
8 with the Department of Public Safety, the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities,  
9 and Substance Abuse Services, and the State Highway Patrol, and pursuant to this subsection, a  
10 drivers license designation that may, upon request, be granted to a person with autism spectrum  
11 disorder, as defined in G.S. 58-3-192(a)(2). The Division shall comply with the following  
12 requirements applicable to the designation:

13 (1) At the request of a person with autism spectrum disorder, the Division shall  
14 enter the designation into the electronic record associated with the person's  
15 drivers license.

16 (2) For the purposes of this subsection, a person shall be considered to have  
17 autism spectrum disorder if the person provides verification or documentation  
18 substantiating a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder that is recommended  
19 by the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and Substance  
20 Abuse Services as acceptable. The Division of Motor Vehicles shall consult  
21 with the Division of Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities, and  
22 Substance Abuse Services to identify acceptable forms of verification that do  
23 not result in undue burden to the person requesting the designation of autism  
24 spectrum disorder. Acceptable documentation shall include any of the  
25 following:

26 a. Documentation of certification or examination by a medical, health, or  
27 mental health professional showing evidence of autism spectrum  
28 disorder.

29 b. Documentation deemed by the Division of Motor Vehicles to qualify  
30 as satisfactory proof of the person's autism spectrum disorder.

31 (3) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as authorizing the issuance of a  
32 drivers license to a person ineligible under G.S. 20-9.

33 (4) Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as prohibiting the issuance of a  
34 drivers license to a person otherwise eligible under the law.

35 (5) Any individual who chooses to register or not to register shall not be deemed  
36 to have waived any protections under the law.



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- 1           (6)    Information collected under this subsection shall only be available to law
- 2                    enforcement and only for the purpose of ensuring mutually safe interactions
- 3                    between law enforcement and persons with autism spectrum disorder. It shall
- 4                    not be accessed or used for any other purpose.
- 5           (7)    The right to make the decision for inclusion or removal of the designation
- 6                    from the database is entirely voluntary and shall only be made by the person
- 7                    who holds the drivers license associated with the designation.
- 8           (8)    The Division, in conjunction with the Department of Health and Human
- 9                    Services, shall develop a process for removal of the designation authorized by
- 10                   this subsection that is available online, by mail, or in person."

11           **SECTION 2.** G.S. 17C-6 reads as rewritten:

12    "**§ 17C-6. Powers of Commission.**

13           (a)    In addition to powers conferred upon the Commission elsewhere in this Article, the  
14 Commission shall have the following powers, which shall be enforceable through its rules and  
15 regulations, certification procedures, or the provisions of G.S. 17C-10:

- 16                    ...
- 17           (17)   Establish minimum educational and training standards for employment and
- 18                    continuing education for criminal justice officers ~~concerning~~concerning both
- 19                    of the following:
- 20                    a.     Recognizing and appropriately interacting with (i) persons who are
- 21                    deaf or hard of ~~hearing~~hearing and (ii) persons with autism spectrum
- 22                    disorder.
- 23                    b.     Drivers license and vehicle registration identifiers of (i) persons who
- 24                    are deaf or hard of hearing, as authorized by G.S. 20-7(q2), or (ii)
- 25                    persons with autism spectrum disorder, as authorized by
- 26                    G.S. 20-7(q3), including that those identifiers are optional.

27                    ...."

28           **SECTION 3.** G.S. 17E-4 reads as rewritten:

29    "**§ 17E-4. Powers and duties of the Commission.**

30           (a)    The Commission shall have the following powers, duties, and responsibilities, which  
31 are enforceable through its rules and regulations, certification procedures, or the provisions of  
32 G.S. 17E-8 and G.S. 17E-9:

- 33                    ...
- 34           (13)   Establish minimum educational and training standards for employment and
- 35                    continuing education for officers ~~concerning~~concerning both of the
- 36                    following:
- 37                    a.     Recognizing and appropriately interacting with (i) persons who are
- 38                    deaf or hard of ~~hearing~~hearing and (ii) persons with autism spectrum
- 39                    disorder.
- 40                    b.     Drivers license and vehicle registration identifiers of (i) persons who
- 41                    are deaf or hard of hearing, as authorized by G.S. 20-7(q2), or (ii)
- 42                    persons with autism spectrum disorder, as authorized by
- 43                    G.S. 20-7(q3), including that those identifiers are optional.

44                    ...."

45           **SECTION 4.** This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to autism  
46 spectrum disorder designation requests made on or after January 1, 2024.
