8	positions in G.S. 126-4(3), the Office of State Human Resources, under the oversight of the State	2

10	(1) <u>Regularly assess the educational, experiential, and training requirements</u>	3
11	necessary for each position within each State agency, department, and	1
12	institution.	
13	(2) Determine when practical experience and training, such as military service, an	
14	apprenticeship, directly related on-the-job experience, a certification from a	
15	Comprehensive Transition and Postsecondary Education program, or a trade	
16	school education, is appropriate to make equivalent to an academic degree in	<u>1</u>
17	the qualification for a position.	
18	(3) Identify jobs for which the educational, experiential, and training	
19	requirements could be reduced from their present level, as well as jobs for	
20	which knowledge, skill, and ability requirements could be made less specific.	_
21	(4) <u>Remove requirements for an academic degree, to the extent practicable, when</u>	<u>1</u>
22	an academic degree is not necessary for the position.	
23	(b) Beginning October 1, 2023, and then annually thereafter, the State Human Resources	_
24	Commission shall report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government	t
25	on its efforts to reduce barriers to State employment as required by this section."
