15			rate of seventy-four hundredths percent (0.74%) applies to gross premiums on
16			insurance contracts for property coverage. The tax is imposed on ten percent
17			(10%) of the gross premiums from insurance contracts for automobile
18			physical damage coverage and on one hundred percent (100%) of the gross
19			premiums from all other contracts for property coverage. Twenty percent
20			(20%) of the net proceeds of this additional tax must be credited to the
21			Volunteer Fire Department Fund established in Article 87 of Chapter 58 of
22			the General Statutes. Twenty percent (20%) of the net proceeds must be
23			credited to the Department of Insurance for disbursement pursuant to
24			G.S. 58-84-25. Up to twenty percent (20%), as determined in accordance with
25			G.S. 58-87-10(f), must be credited to the Workers' Compensation Fund. Fund
26			but in no event shall the fund reserve exceed forty-five million dollars
27			(\$45,000,000), and the balance of the twenty percent (20%) must be credited
28			to the Department of Insurance to be used to fund the Firefighters' Cancer
29			Insurance Program. The remaining net proceeds must be credited to the
30			General Fund. The additional tax imposed on property coverage contracts
31			under this subdivision is a special purpose assessment based on gross
32			premiums and not a gross premiums tax.

2	SECTION 3.(a) G.S. 153A-233 reads as rewritten:
3	"§ 153A-233. Fire-fighting and prevention services.
4	A county may establish, organize, equip, support, and maintain a fire department; may
5	prescribe the duties of the fire department; may provide financial assistance to incorporated
6	volunteer fire departments; may contract for fire-fighting or prevention services with one or more
7	counties, cities or other units of local government, incorporated volunteer-fire departments, or
8	with an agency of the State government; and may for these purposes appropriate funds not
9	otherwise limited as to use by law. A county shall ensure that any county, city or other unit of
10	local government, or incorporated volunteer fire department with whom the county contracts for
11	fire-fighting or prevention services shall obtain a criminal history record check of any person
12	over the age of 18 who applies for a paid or volunteer position providing fire-fighting or
13	prevention services. The criminal history record check shall be conducted and evaluated as
14	provided in G.S. 143B-943. G.S. 143B-943, or, if an applicant has been a resident of North
15	Carolina for over five years and reports no charges or convictions on the application, the record
16	check requirement of this section may be conducted through the county clerk of court or a
17	third-party vendor. The county may also designate fire districts or parts of existing districts and
18	prescribe the boundaries thereof for insurance grading purposes."

23	G.S. 143B-943.G.S. 143B-943, or, if an applicant has been a resident of North Carolina for over
24	five years and reports no charges or convictions on the application, the record check requirement
25	of this subsection may be conducted through the county clerk of court or a third-party vendor."
