12		destruction or otherwise make the presence of the firearm or weapon of mass

14		(2) Firearm. – As defined in G.S. 14-409.39.
15		(3) Weapon of mass death and destruction. – As defined in G.S. 14-288.8.
16	<u>(b)</u>	Offense It is unlawful for any person who is prohibited pursuant to G.S. 14-415.1

23		and destruction during the commission or attempted commission of the felony.
24		(2) A Class F felony, if the person brandishes the firearm or weapon of mass death
25		and destruction during the commission or attempted commission of the felony.
26		(3) <u>A Class G felony for any other violation of subsection (b) of this section.</u>
27	<u>(d)</u>	<u>Separate Offense. – A violation of subsection (b) of this section is a separate offense</u>
28		underlying felony offense, and G.S. 14-415.1, and shall not merge with any other
29	offense."	
30		SECTION 2. G.S. 14-415.1(a) reads as rewritten:
31	"(a)	It shall be unlawful for any person who has been convicted of a felony to purchase,
32	· 1	sess, or have in his custody, care, or control any firearm or any weapon of mass death
33		action as defined in G.S. 14-288.8(c). For the purposes of this section, a firearm is (i)
34	any weapon, including a starter gun, which will or is designed to or may readily be converted to	



expel a projectile by the action of an explosive, or its frame or receiver, or (ii) any firearm muffler

or firearm silencer. This section does not apply to an antique firearm, as defined in 1 2 G.S. 14-409.11.

- Every person violating the provisions of this section shall be punished as a Class G felon. 3 Violation of this section is not a lesser included offense of G.S. 14-415.1A." 4
- 5 SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses
- committed on or after that date. 6
