Senator Smith

1 moves to amend the bill on page 13, lines 32-33, by inserting between the lines the following 2 new section to read:

3 **"TRANSFER OF PREGNANCY CENTER FUNDS** 

4 SECTION 2.3. Notwithstanding any provision of the Committee Report described 5 in Section 43.2 of this act to the contrary, the funds provided to the Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship in item 214 if the Committee Report shall be reduced by the sum of six million five 6 7 hundred thousand dollars (\$6,500,000) in the 2023-2024 fiscal year and by the sum of five 8 hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in the 2024-2025 fiscal year, and the amount if 9 unappropriated funds in the General Fund increased by the sum of six million five hundred 10 thousand dollars (\$6,500,000) in the 2023-2024 fiscal year and by the sum of five hundred 11 thousand dollars (\$500,000) in the 2024-2025 fiscal year."; and

# "LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS WITH FIVE YEARS OF SERVICE **RECEIVE FIVE-YEAR TENURE PAY SUPPLEMENT**

16 SECTION 39.16A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or of the Committee 17 Report referenced in Section 43.2 of this act to the contrary, the funds appropriated by this act from the General Fund to the Office of State Budget and Management shall be increased by 18 dollars (\$150,000,000) in recurring funds in each year of the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium to 19 20 provide local governments with funds for salary supplements to local law enforcement officers having five or more years of service. Jailers and probation officers are not eligible to receive 21 22 these supplements."; and

Boards may hire full-time 29 30 or part-time nurses directly or contract with a third party to provide nursing 31 services."

16	(a) Credit. – A taxpayer who (i) is allowed an exemption for a qualifying relative pursuant				
17	to section 152 of the Code and (ii) has an adjusted gross income less than the amount listed in				
18	the table below is allowed a credit under this section against the tax imposed by this Part for each				
19	qualifying relative for whom the taxpayer is allowed the federal exemption. The amount of the				
20	credit is equal to three thousand dollars (\$3,000) if the qualifying relative is a veteran of the				
21	Armed Forces of the United States and is one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) for any				
22	other qualifying relative. The applicable adjusted gross income limit for a taxpayer is as follows:				
23	Filing Status <u>AGI</u>				
24	Married, filing jointly/surviving spouse \$150,000				
25	Head of Household \$112,500				
26	<u>Single</u> <u>\$75,000</u>

28	(b) <u>Limitations. – A nonresident or part-year resident who claims the credit allowed by</u>				
29 20	this section shall reduce the amount of the credit by multiplying it by the fraction calculated under				
30 21	G.S. 105-153.4. The credit allowed under this section may not exceed the amount of tax imposed				
31 32	by this Part for the taxable year reduced by the sum of all credits allowable, except payments of				
32 33	tax made by or on behalf of the taxpayer." SECTION 42.5A.(b) This section is effective for taxable years beginning on or after				
33 34	January 1, 2023."; and

40	to the Office of State Budget and Management – Special Appropriations the sum of seven million				
41	dollars (\$7,000,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium to be used to				
42	provide a directed grant to the City of Farmville to plan and construct a new fire station to				
43	effectively serve the City's residents."; and
