11 **SECTION 5.(a)** G.S. 130A-50 is amended by adding two new subsections to read:

12 "(f) A sanitary district board may adopt a resolution to require the election of the sanitary
13 district board to be at the time of the election for county officers. The resolution shall be delivered
14 to the county board of elections prior to July 1 of the odd-numbered year. If the resolution is
15 received by the county board of elections prior to July 1 of the odd-numbered year, the current
16 terms of office of members of that sanitary district board shall be extended by one year and the
17 next election conducted in the following even-numbered year.

18 (g) If a sanitary district board lies wholly within a county and no resident voter of the
19 district filed a notice of candidacy in the previous election for the sanitary district board, the
20 board of county commissioners may adopt a resolution to require the election of the sanitary
21 district board to be at the time of the election for county officers. The resolution shall be delivered
22 to the county board of elections prior to July 1 of the odd-numbered year. If the resolution is
23 received by the county board of elections prior to July 1 of the odd-numbered year, the current
24 terms of office of members of that sanitary district board shall be extended by one year and the
25 next election conducted in the following even-numbered year."

26 **SECTION 5.(b)** Notwithstanding G.S. 130A-50(f), as enacted by this act, a sanitary
27 district board may deliver the resolution requiring elections to be at the time of the election for
28 county officers no later than August 1, 2023. If the resolution is received by the county board of
29 elections by August 1, 2023, the county board of elections shall cancel all notices of candidacy
30 and petitions submitted in 2023 with respect to the election of that sanitary district board and
31 conduct the next election in 2024.

1 **SECTION 5.(c)** Notwithstanding G.S. 130A-50(g), as enacted by this act, a board
2 of county commissioners may deliver the resolution requiring elections to be at the time of the
3 election for county officers no later than August 1, 2023. If the resolution is received by the
4 county board of elections by August 1, 2023, the county board of elections shall cancel all notices
5 of candidacy and petitions submitted in 2023 with respect to the election of that sanitary district
6 board and conduct the next election in 2024.

7 **SECTION 5.(d)** This Part is effective when it becomes law, and applies to elections
8 held on or after that date.

10 **PART V. BAR TECHNICAL CORRECTION**

11 **SECTION 6.(a)** G.S. 18B-1000(1) reads as rewritten:

12 "(1) Bar. – An establishment that is primarily engaged in the business of selling
13 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises. ~~A bar shall not include~~
14 ~~a brewery, winery, or distillery."~~

15 **SECTION 6.(b)** This Part becomes effective August 1, 2023.
