moves to amend the bill on page 1, line 3, by deleting "COMMISSIONERS" and substituting "COMMISSIONERS;";

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and on page 1, line 4, by deleting "AND";

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and on page 1, line 5, by inserting "FOR" after "PROCESS";

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and on page 1, line 5, by deleting "EDUCATION." and substituting "EDUCATION; AND TO MODIFY THE METHOD OF ELECTION OF THE BUNCOMBE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.":

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and on page 3, lines 9-10, by rewriting those lines to read:

"SECTION 4.(a) Section 1 of Chapter 936 of the Session Laws of 1963, as amended by referendum under G.S. 153A-58 to increase the size to four members plus the separately elected chairman, as amended by Chapter 129 of the 1983 Session Laws to provide for a board of five members which elects its own chairman, and as amended again by referendum in 1984 under G.S. 153A-58 to provide for four members plus the separately elected chairman, as amended by S.L. 2011-81, and S.L. 2011-407, reads as rewritten:

"Section 1.(a) The Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County shall consist of six members plus the chairman.

- In 2012 and quadrennially thereafter, the chairman shall be elected separately by all the qualified voters of Buncombe County.
- In 2012, two commissioners shall be elected from each of the three House of Representatives Districts in Buncombe County. In each district the person receiving the highest number of votes is elected to a four-year term, and the person receiving the second highest number of votes is elected to a two-year term. In 2014 and biennially thereafter, one commissioner shall be elected from each district for a four-year term. Each member shall reside in and represent one of the districts, district, and only the qualified voters of that district are eligible to vote for that district seat. The districts shall be numbered 1, 2, and 3 and shall correspond to the numerical order of the three house districts. The districts shall be those



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established by the Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County and revised as needed following the return of a federal decennial census.

(d) If after the 2020 or subsequent censuses Buncombe County is not entitled to exactly three House of Representatives districts, the Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County may redistrict the three county commissioner districts in accordance with G.S. 153A-22, but in doing so shall only deviate from the boundaries of the three House of Representatives districts to the extent necessary to account as appropriate either for (i) areas of Buncombe County not in one of those three house districts or (ii) areas in another county or counties located in one or more of the three house districts. Notwithstanding Part 4 of Article 4 of Chapter 153A of the General Statutes, the structure of the Buncombe County Board of Commissioners shall not be altered under that Part prior to the return of the 2020 census."

SECTION 4.(b) Notwithstanding Section 4(a) of this act, for the 2024 election, the election districts shall be those established by S.L. 2022-4 for the three House of Representatives Districts in Buncombe County. If, after the 2024 elections, the Board of Commissioners of Buncombe County fails to establish election districts prior to November 1, 2025, the election districts shall continue to be those established by S.L. 2022-4 for the three House of Representatives Districts in Buncombe County until the return of the 2030 federal decennial census.

SECTION 5. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law and applies to elections held on or after that date.".
