(b) The prohibition in subsection (a) of this section does not apply if the audio or visual		
	ies with all of the requirements of this subsection and includes a disclosure	
<u>"This</u>	has been manipulated or generated by artificial intelligence." The blar	
disclosure must be filled with whichever of the following terms most accurately describes the		
media: (i) image, (ii) video, or (iii) audio.		



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- (1) For visual media, the text of the disclosure shall appear in a size that is easily readable by the average viewer and no smaller than the largest font size of other text appearing in the visual media. If the visual media does not include any other text, the disclosure shall appear in a size that is easily readable by the average viewer.
- <u>(2)</u> For visual media that is video, the disclosure shall appear for the duration of the video.
- If the media consists of audio only, the disclosure shall be read in a clearly <u>(3)</u> spoken manner and in a pitch that can be easily heard by the average listener, at the beginning of the audio, at the end of the audio, and, if the audio is greater than two minutes in length, interspersed within the audio at intervals of not greater than two minutes each.

"§ 163-332. Use of deceptive and fraudulent deepfake to influence an election; penalty.

- A candidate whose appearance, action, or speech is depicted using a deceptive and fraudulent deepfake in violation of this Article may seek injunctive or other equitable relief prohibiting the publication of the deceptive and fraudulent deepfake.
- A person may be held liable by the State Board of Elections for civil penalties for violating this Article without the appropriate disclosures and fined as follows:
 - If the person commits the violation within five years of one or more prior (1) violations under this section, to payment of a fine of not more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
 - If the person commits the violation with the intent to cause violence or bodily <u>(2)</u> harm, to payment of a fine of not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000).
 - (3) In other cases, to payment of a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).
- This section does not apply to a radio or television broadcasting station, including a cable or satellite television operator, programmer, or producer:
 - That broadcasts a deceptive and fraudulent deepfake prohibited by this section (1) as part of a bona fide newscast, news interview, news documentary, or on the spot coverage of bona fide news events, if the broadcast clearly acknowledges through content or a disclosure, in a manner that can be easily heard or read by the average listener or viewer, that there are questions about the authenticity of the materially deceptive audio or visual media.
 - When it is paid to broadcast a deceptive and fraudulent deepfake and has made **(2)** a good-faith effort to establish the depiction is not a deceptive and fraudulent deepfake.
- (d) This section does not apply to an internet website, or a regularly published newspaper, magazine, or other periodical of general circulation, including an internet or electronic publication, that routinely carries news and commentary of general interest, and that publishes materially deceptive audio or visual media prohibited by this section, if the publication clearly states that the materially deceptive audio or visual media does not accurately represent the speech or conduct of the candidate.
- This section does not apply to materially deceptive audio or visual media that constitutes satire or parody.

"§ 163-333. Miscellaneous.

- The provisions of this Article are severable. If any provision of this Article or its application is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- The clear proceeds of any civil penalties imposed under this Article shall be remitted to the Civil Penalty and Forfeiture Fund as required by G.S. 115C-457.2."

SECTION 2. Effective July 1, 2024, there is appropriated from the General Fund to 1 2 3 the State Board of Elections the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 2024-2025 fiscal year to enforce the provisions of this act. 4
