8	(a) <u>Short Title. – This Part</u>	shall be known as Taylor's Law Establishing the Advisory	
9	Council on Rare Diseases.

12	Department of Health and Human Services to advise the Governor, the Secretary, and the General		
13	Assembly on research, diagnosis, treatment, and education relating to rare diseases. This Part		
14	shall be known as Taylor's Law Establishing the Advisory Council on Rare Diseases. For		
15	purposes of this Part, "rare disease" has the same meaning as provided in 21 U.S.C. § 360bb.

42	(c1) Vacancies and Removals. – Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the advisory council		
43			on, dismissal, death, or disability of a member shall be filled by the

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1	appointing authority for the balance of the unexpired term. Each appointing authority may		
2	remove any men	nber appointed by that appointing authority for misfeasance, malfeasance, or	
3	nonfeasance.		
4	(d) <u>Per Diem and Expenses.</u> – Members of the advisory council shall receive per diem		
5		wel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5	
6	or G.S. 138-6 o	r travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of	
7	G.S. 120-3.1, as	applicable.	
8	(e) <u>Administrative Support. – All administrative support and other services required by</u>		
9	the advisory council shall be provided by the School of Medicine of the University of North		
10	Carolina at Chapel Hill.Department.		
11	(f) Upon the recommendation of the Dean of the School of Medicine of the University		
12		a at Chapel Hill, Selection of Chair. – The Secretary shall select the chair of the	
13		from among the members of the council. The chair shall serve in this position	
14	until the expiration of his or her term.		
15	(g) The c	hair shall convene the first meeting of the advisory council no later than October	
16	1, 2015. Meetings and Quorum. – A majority of the council members shall constitute a quorum.		
17	A majority vote of a quorum shall be required for any official action of the advisory council.		
18	Following the first meeting, the advisory council shall meet at least quarterly. The advisory		
19	council may meet more frequently upon the call of the chair or upon the request of a majority of		
20	council members

30		c. Identification of policy issues related to rare diseases and the	
31		advancement of policy initiatives related to rare diseases at the State	
32		and federal levels.	
33		d. The appropriation of State funds to facilitate increased public	
34		awareness of and improved treatment for rare diseases.

37		not later than January 1, 2016, and annually thereafter, on the activities of the

40		statutory changes and amendments to the structure, organization, and powers

43		health, and hospitals licensed to operate in the State that provide care to

3		State for persons diagnosed with a rare disease.	
4	<u>(4)</u>	Advise and consult with the Department, the North Carolina Drug Utilization	
5		Review Board, and the Medicaid Preferred Drug List Review Panel in	
6		developing recommendations, resources, and programs relating to the	
7		diagnosis and treatment of rare diseases.	
8	<u>(5)</u>	Identify additional relevant areas for the advisory council to study and	
9		evaluate."

11	funds available to	the Department to cover the administrative costs of the Advisory Council on	
12	Rare Diseases authorized by this section.";
