7	Whereas, Ombudsmen serve and protect some of the most vulnerable and needy
8	citizens in our State-residents of nursing homes, adult care homes, and family care homes; and
9	Whereas, Ombudsmen advocate for residents' rights; work to improve the quality of
10	care provided in facilities; and assist residents, family members, and providers in resolving
11	potentially contentious issues without resorting to formal complaint processes, thereby saving
12	the State and residents time and resources; and
13	Whereas, the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Aging and
14	Adult Services, oversees the State Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program; Now, therefore,
15	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
16	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
17	Health and Human Services, Division of Aging and Adult Services, the sum of three hundred
18	eighty thousand dollars (\$380,000) in recurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year and the sum
19	of three hundred ninety-seven thousand dollars (\$397,000) in recurring funds for the 2026-2027
20	fiscal year, to create four full-time ombudsman positions within the Office of the State
21	Long-Term Care Ombudsman in the Division of Aging and Adult Services, in order to move
22	North Carolina toward national standards for long-term care ombudsman programs.
