8	<u>(a)</u>	<u>Defini</u>	tions. – The following definitions apply in this section:			
9		<u>(1)</u>	Aquatic activities Activities that take place in or around a body of water,			
10			such as swimming, swimming instruction, wading, or visits to water parks.			
11			The term does not include water play activities, such as water table play, slip			
12			and slide activities, or playing in sprinklers.			
13		<u>(2)</u>	Day camp. – A recreation program that offers care to three or more school-age			
14			children and operates for less than four consecutive months per year.			
15		<u>(3)</u>	Public swimming pool. – As regulated under Part 10 of Article 8 of Chapter			
16			130A of the General Statutes, any structure, chamber, or tank containing an			
17			artificial body of water used by the public for swimming, diving, wading,			
18			recreation, or therapy, together with buildings, appurtenances, and equipment			
19			used in connection with the body of water, regardless of whether a fee is			
20			charged for its use. The term includes municipal, school, hotel, motel,			
21			apartment, boarding house, athletic club, or other membership facility pools			
22			and spas, spas operating for display at temporary events, and artificial			
23			swimming lagoons.			
24		<u>(4)</u>	School-age child. – Any child who is attending or who has attended a public			
25			or private grade school or kindergarten and meets age requirements as			
26			specified in G.S. 115C-364. For purposes of this section, the term includes a			
27			child up to 18 years of age.			
28	<u>(b)</u>	Scope.	This section shall govern the mandatory requirements for lifeguard			
29	<u>supervisio</u>		nool-age children participating in aquatic activities at day camps.			
30	<u>(c)</u>	-	rements. – A day camp offering aquatic activities shall provide an individual			
31			nt lifeguard training certificate issued by the Red Cross or other training

-	<u>(1)</u>	A ratio of two lifeguards for the first 25 children and one additional lifeguard		
		for every 15 children or portion thereof.		
	<u>(2)</u>	A lifeguard chair that positions the lifeguard at a height no less than 6 feet		
		from the ground.		
	<u>(3)</u>	A mandatory swim test in a public swimming pool before aquatic activities		
		begin. If a child is unable to swim across the public swimming pool, then a		
		properly fitted, U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket is required for that		
		participant at all times while engaging in aquatic activities.		
	<u>(4)</u>	If a U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket is required pursuant to subdivision		
		(3) of this subsection, the life jacket shall meet the following requirements:		
		a. <u>Appropriately sized for the intended child.</u>		
		b. In good and serviceable condition.		
		<u>c.</u> <u>Properly stowed when not in use, but readily accessible.</u>		
<u>(d)</u>	<u>Partic</u>	cipation in the following types of aquatic activities is prohibited under this		
section:				
	<u>(1)</u>	Hot tubs.		
	<u>(2)</u>	<u>Spas.</u>		
	<u>(3)</u>	Saunas or steam rooms.		
	<u>(4)</u>	Portable wading pools.		
	<u>(5)</u>	Other unfiltered, nondisinfected containments of water."
