SECTION 2. Effective July 1, 2025, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina Clubhouse Coalition, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000) in recurring funds for each year of the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium to be used to provide funding for member clubhouses for current programs, expansion of services or locations served, accreditation of a clubhouse, or staff training and professional development.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
