Short Title: UNC Tuition Discounts for Certain Students. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: March 12, 2025 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO PERMIT CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH 3 CAROLINA TO PROVIDE DISCOUNTED TUITION TO PERSONS RECEIVING 4 MILITARY TUITION ASSISTANCE OR PERSONS ENROLLED IN AN 5 EMPLOYER-SPONSORED FINANCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAM. 6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 7 **SECTION 1.** G.S. 116-143 reads as rewritten: 8 "§ 116-143. State-supported institutions of higher education required to charge tuition and 9 fees. 10 . . . 11 (c) Inasmuch as the giving of tuition and fee waivers, or especially reduced rates, 12 represent in effect a variety of scholarship awards, the said practice is hereby prohibited except when expressly authorized by statute. 13 14 Notwithstanding the above provision relating to the abolition of free tuition, the Board <del>(d)</del> of Governors of The University of North Carolina may, in its discretion, provide regulations 15 under which personnel may during the period of normal employment enroll in The University of 16 North Carolina free of charge for tuition and fees, provided such enrollment does not interfere 17 18 with normal employment obligations and further provided that such enrollments are not counted 19 for the purpose of receiving General Fund appropriations as follows: 20 Except as provided in subdivision (2) of this subsection, a full-time faculty (1)21 member of the rank of full-time instructor or above and any full-time staff 22 member of The University of North Carolina may enroll in not more than three 23 courses per year. 24 (2)A full-time or part-time campus law enforcement officer may enroll in the number of courses per year determined by regulation. 25 Notwithstanding subsection (c) of this section, the Board of Governors of The 26 (d1) 27 University of North Carolina may do any of the following: Personnel. - Provide regulations under which personnel may enroll in The 28 (1)University of North Carolina free of charge for tuition and fees during the 29 period of normal employment if the (i) enrollment does not interfere with 30 31 normal employment obligations and (ii) enrollments are not counted for the 32 purpose of receiving General Fund appropriations. Personnel may enroll free 33 of charge for tuition and fees as follows: A full-time faculty member of the rank of full-time instructor or above 34 a. of The University of North Carolina may enroll in not more than three 35 36 courses per year.
