6	Whereas, college athletics have long played a fundamental role in the culture and economy of North Carolina, fostering school spirit, community engagement, and regional pride;

8	Whereas, recent conference realignments driven primarily by financial incentives			
9	have disrupted traditional rivalries, diminished regional competition, and eroded the historic			
10	significance of intrastate athletic contests; and			
11	Whereas, the General Assembly recognizes the critical importance of maintaining and			
12	strengthening these historic rivalries, which provide economic benefits to local businesses,			
13	increase fan engagement, and sustain the integrity of collegiate athletics within the State; and			
14	Whereas, ensuring regular competition among North Carolina's major collegiate			
15	athletic programs will not only generate substantial revenue and tourism impact, but also			
16	reinforce the long-standing traditions that define the State's athletic legacy; Now, therefore,			
17	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
18	SECTION 1. Part 3 of Article 1 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended			
19	by adding a new section to read:			
20	" <u>§ 116-40.14. Intrastate athletic competition.</u>			
21	(a) <u>Purpose. – The purpose of this section is to ensure that high-enrollment constituent</u>			
22	institutions of The University of North Carolina regularly compete against one another in eligible			
23	<u>sports.</u>			
24	(b) Definitions. – For purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply:			
25	(1) Eligible sport. – All of the following:
