<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> This section is effective October 1, 2025, and applies to insurance		
contracts issued, renewed, or amended on or after that date.		
<b>SECTION 2.</b> Effective with the January 1, 2026, plan coverage year, the Board of		
Trustees for the North Carolina State Health Plan for Teachers and State Employees (State Health		
Plan) shall remove any annual or lifetime limitations on the coverage for ovulation medication		
and ovulation induction cycles for services offered in-network under the State Health Plan. Any		



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limitation on coverage for ovulation medication shall not be different than the limitations imposed on other prescription medications.

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**SECTION 3.** Effective July 1, 2025, there is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of State Treasurer the sum of three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) in recurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year and the sum of six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) in recurring funds for the 2026-2027 fiscal year for the increased costs to the State Health Plan as a result of the implementation of Section 2 of this act.

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**SECTION 4.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes law.

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
