

9	"(a)	Purpos	ose of the Practice of Dentistry. – The practice of dentistry in the State of North				
10	Carolina is	hereby	<u>declared to affect affects</u> the public health, safety and welfare and to be subject				
11			control by the State in the public interest. It is further declared to be a matter of				
12	public inte	erest an	d concern that the dental profession merit and receive the confidence of the				
13	public and	l that of	nly qualified persons be permitted to practice dentistry in the State of North				
14	Carolina. This Article shall be liberally construed to carry out these objects and purposes."						
15	SECTION 1.(c) G.S. 90-22(b) reads as rewritten:						
16	"(b) <u>Creation. – The North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners heretofore</u>						
17	previously created by Chapter 139, Public Laws 1879 and by Chapter 178, Public Laws 1915, is						
18			as the agency of the State for the regulation of the practice of dentistry in this				
19	State. It is a matter of public interest that State officials must possess and exercise power to						
20			private parties and disapprove those that fail to accord with State policy. The
