The joint resolution of the four counties shall state the terms relating to <u>the</u> compensation to <u>of</u> commissioners, if any, compensation of consultants and staff members employed by the Commission, and reimbursement of expenses incurred by commissioners, consultants, and employees. The Commission <u>shall be is</u> governed by <u>such any</u> budgetary and accounting procedures as may be specified by joint resolution.

6 "§ 77-89.5. Organization and meetings.

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7 Upon creation of the Commission, its governing board shall meet at a time and place agreed 8 upon by the boards of the four counties concerned. counties. The commissioners shall elect a 9 chairman chair and such any other officers as that they may choose. All officers shall serve 10 one-year terms. The governing board shall adopt such rules and regulations as it may deem necessary, not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act-Article or of any joint resolution, for 11 12 the proper discharge of its duties and for the governance of the Commission. The chairman chair 13 may appoint such committees as may be that have been authorized by such rules and regulations. 14 regulation. The Commission shall meet regularly at such any times and places as may be specified 15 in its <del>rules and regulations</del> or in any joint resolution. Special meetings may be called as specified 16 in the rules and regulations.

### 17 "§ 77-89.6. Powers of Commission; administrative provision.

(a) Within the limits of funds available to it and subject to the provisions of this Act
 <u>Article</u> and of any joint resolution, the Commission may:may do all of the following:

- (1) Hire and <u>Fix\_fix\_the compensation of permanent and temporary employees</u> and staff as it may deem that are necessary in carrying out its duties.
  - (2) Contract with consultants for such services as it may require. services.
- (3) Contract with the State of North Carolina or the Federal Government, <u>federal government</u>, or any agency or department or subdivision thereof, <del>for such property or services as may be provided to or by such agencies, and carry out the provisions of such contracts.or any other person.</del>
  - (4) Contract with persons, firms, and corporations generally as to all matters over which it has a proper concern, and carry out the provisions of such contracts.
- (5)(4) Lease, rent, purchase, or otherwise obtain suitable quarters and office space
   for its employees and staff, staff and lease, rent, purchase, or otherwise obtain
   furniture, fixtures, aircraft, vessels, vehicles, firearms, uniforms, and other
   supplies and equipment necessary or desirable for carrying out the duties
   imposed in or under the authority of this Act.equipment.
- 34 (6)(5) Lease, rent, purchase, construct, otherwise obtain, maintain, operate, repair, 35 and replace, either on its own or in cooperation with other public or private 36 agencies or individuals, any of the following: parks, shoreline and water 37 recreational areas, swimming pools and swimming areas, marinas, fishing 38 piers, boat docks, boating and fishing access areas, navigation aids, waterway 39 markers, public information signs and notices, and other items of real and 40 personal property designed to enhance public recreation, public safety in Lake 41 Norman and its shoreline area, or protection of property in the shoreline area.

42 (b) The Commission may accept, receive, and disburse in furtherance of its functions any 43 funds, grants, services, or property made available by the Federal Government federal 44 government or its agencies or subdivisions, by the State Government or its agencies or 45 subdivisions, or by private and civic sources.

(c) The boards of the four counties may appropriate funds to the Commission out of
surplus funds or funds derived from nontax sources. They may <u>also</u> appropriate funds out of tax
revenues and may <u>also levy</u> annually <u>levy</u> taxes for the payment of <u>such-the</u> appropriation as a
special <u>purpose</u>, in addition to any allowed by the Constitution.purpose.

50 (d) The Commission shall be is subject to such any audit requirements as may be 51 specified in any joint resolution.

1 (e) In carrying out some or all of its duties and in either in addition to or in lieu of 2 exercising various provisions of the above authorizations, the <u>The</u> Commission may, with the 3 agreement of the board of the county concerned, utilize personnel and property of or assign 4 responsibilities to any officer or employee of any of the four counties. <u>Such A</u> contribution in 5 <u>kind, if substantial, may kind may, with the agreement of the other three counties counties, be</u> 6 deemed to <u>substitute a substitute</u>, in whole or in <u>part-part</u>, for the financial contribution required 7 of <u>such-the</u> county in support of the Commission.

8 (f) Unless otherwise specified by joint resolution, each of the four counties shall annually 9 contribute an equal financial contribution to the Commission in an amount appropriate to support 10 the activities of the Commission in carrying out its duties.

11 "§ 77-89.7. Filing and publication of joint resolutions.

12 (a) A copy of the joint resolution creating the Commission and of any joint resolution 13 amending or repealing the joint resolution creating the Commission shall be filed with the 14 Executive Director of the Wildlife <u>Resources</u> Commission. When the Executive Director 15 receives resolutions that are in substance identical from all four counties concerned, the 16 Executive Director shall within ten days so certify and distribute a certified single resolution text 17 to the following:

Upon request, the Executive Director shall also send a certified single copy of any and all

24 (b) Unless a joint resolution specifies a later date, it shall take takes effect when the 25 Executive Director's certified text has been submitted to the Secretary of State for filing. 26 Certifications of the Executive Director under the seal of the Commission as to the text or 27 amended text of any joint resolution and of the date or dates of submission to the Secretary of 28 State shall be are admissible in evidence in any court. 36 "§ 77-89.8. Regulatory authority.

37 (a) Except as limited in subsection (b) below, by subsection (c) of this section, by restrictions in any joint resolution, and or by other supervening provisions of law, the 38 39 Commission may make regulations applicable to Lake Norman and its shoreline area concerning 40 all matters relating to or affecting public recreation and water safety. These regulations may shall not conflict with or supersede provisions of general or special Acts or of regulations of State 41 42 agencies promulgated under the authority of general law. State law. In lieu of or in addition to 43 passing regulations supplementary to State law and regulations concerning the operation of vessels on Lake Norman, these regulations, the Commission may, after public notice, request 44 45 that the Wildlife Resources Commission pass local regulations rules on this subject in accordance 46 with the procedure established in G.S. 75A-15.

47 (b) Violation of any regulation of the Commission commanding or prohibiting an act
48 shall be a misdemeanor is punishable by a fine civil penalty not to exceed five hundred dollars
49 (\$500.00) per violation.

50 (c) The regulations promulgated under this Section take effect upon passage or upon such
