3 **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 4 Commerce the recurring sum of ten million five hundred thousand dollars (\$10,500,000) in 5 nonrecurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to be allocated to the North Carolina 6 Technology Coalitions Strategic Support Fund for purposes consistent with that Fund.

7 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2025.
