The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

10	<b>SECTION 1.</b> This act shall be known and may be cited as the "North Carolina"
10	Reclaiming College Education on America's Constitutional Heritage Act" or the "NC REACH

18	"(3) The Except as provided in subdivision (15) of this section, the Board shall
19	determine the functions, educational activities and academic programs of the
20	constituent institutions. The Board shall also determine the types of degrees
21	to be awarded. The powers herein given to the Board shall not be restricted by
22	any provision of law assigning specific functions or responsibilities to
23	designated institutions, the powers herein given superseding any such
24	provisions of law. The Board, after adequate notice and after affording the
25	institutional board of trustees an opportunity to be heard, shall have authority
26	to withdraw approval of any existing program if it appears that the program is
27	unproductive, excessively costly or unnecessarily duplicative. The Board shall
28	review the productivity of academic degree programs every two years, using
29	criteria specifically developed to determine program productivity."

31	"(15) The Board of Governors shall adopt a policy requiring each constituent
32	institution of The University of North Carolina to require at least three credit
