10		ECTION 1.1. The Department of Information Tech	nology shall issue a request for
11		the development and creation of a disaster relief	
12		that will operate as a central platform for relevant u	-
13	in response to natural disasters occurring in the State. The disaster focused constituent		
14	engagement portal shall be designed to consolidate critical information and programs from all		
15	relevant State agency websites into a single, centralized portal where affected citizens can engage		
16	with State agencies, find resources, and receive real-time information.		
17	SECTION 1.2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
18	Information Technology the sum of five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) in nonrecurring		
19	funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year to be used for the purposes described in this Part.		
20	SI	ECTION 1.3. This Part becomes effective July 1, 2	025.

22		ONTRACTOR LIABILITY LIMITS/STATE CO	
23		ECTION 2.1. Article 3 of Chapter 143 of the G	eneral Statutes is amended by
24	adding a new section to read:		
25		<u>Contractor liability in State contracts.</u>	and Antisla 9 of this Charton
26		Il contracts subject to the provisions of this Article	-
27 28	shall include a limitation on the contractor's liability to the State for damages. Except as otherwise		
28 29	provided in this section, the limitation of liability shall be for damages arising from any cause whatsoever, regardless of the form of action. The amount of liability shall be determined based		
30	on the nature of the goods, services, or construction work covered by the contract; however, there		
31	shall be a presumptive limitation of no more than two times the value of the contract. Limitation		
32	of liability pursuant to this section shall specifically include, but not be limited to, the contractor's		
33	liability for damages. The amount of liability for damages may be raised to no more than three		
34		ue of the contract if all of the following apply:	
			



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1	(1) The Secretary or the Secretary's designee completes a risk assessment prior to		
2	the bid solicitation or request for proposals that determines an increase in the		
3	liability amount is necessary to protect the State's best interests.		
4	(2) The bid solicitation or request for proposals indicates that increased liability		
5	will be required for the resulting contract.		
6	(b) Prior to entering into any contract subject to the provisions of this Article or Article		
7	8 of this Chapter, the Secretary or the Secretary's designee shall reasonably determine that the		
8	contractor possesses sufficient financial resources, either independently or through third-party		
9	sources, such as insurance, to satisfy the agreed upon limitation of liability. The limitation of		
10	liability required by this section shall not apply to liability of the contractor for intentional or		
11	willful misconduct, damage to tangible personal property, or physical injuries to persons.		
12	Nothing in this subsection limits the contractor's liability directly to third parties or affects the		
13	rights and obligations related to contribution among joint tortfeasors established by Chapter 1B		
14	of the General Statutes and other applicable law.		
15	(c) Not later than March 1 of each year, the Secretary shall report annually to the Joint		
16	Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and the Joint Legislative Oversight		
17	Committee on General Government regarding the contracts containing liability amounts of more		
18	than two times the value of the contract."		
19	SECTION 2.2. This Part is effective when it becomes law and applies to contracts		
20	awarded, renewed, or amended on or after that date.
