#### **General Assembly Of North Carolina** Session 2025 As used in this section, the term "pregnancy center" means any nonprofit organization 1 (a) 2 other than a hospital, ambulatory surgical facility, or clinic that performs abortions, that holds itself out as a facility that provides care for pregnant women, including pregnancy counseling 3 4 services, pregnancy testing, and other nonmedical pregnancy services. 5 The Department shall adopt rules establishing performance standards for pregnancy (b) centers operating in this State. The rules shall, at a minimum, establish a monitoring mechanism 6 7 and reporting requirements to facilitate the Department periodically assessing whether pregnancy 8 centers are adhering to the established performance standards. The reporting requirements shall, 9 at a minimum, require pregnancy centers to annually report to the Department at least all of the 10 following information for the preceding five-year period: 11 All contracts and agreements entered into with the State of North Carolina or (1)Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship (CPCF), a nonprofit organization, during 12 13 the preceding five-year period. 14 (2)A list of all monetary transactions between the pregnancy center and State of North Carolina or CPCF. 15 Itemized annual expenditures for all of the following: 16 (3) 17 Individual employees, with a breakdown of the number of full-time a. 18 and part-time staff, the number of hours worked by each full-time and 19 part-time staff member, and the salaries and wages paid to each staff 20 member. 21 Administrative supplies and materials, with an explanation of the <u>b.</u> 22 purposes for these items. All supplies and materials provided to individuals served by the 23 <u>c.</u> 24 pregnancy center, including: 25 1.
