8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
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10	MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENTS BETWEEN DEQ AND USEPA TO REQUIRE
11	GENERAL ASSEMBLY APPROVAL
12	SECTION 1.(a) Article 7 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by
13	adding a new section to read:
14	"§ 143B-279.4B. Requirements for Department administration of federally delegated
15	environmental programs.
16	All memorandums of agreement between the United States Environmental Protection
17	Agency and the Department of Environmental Quality, the Environmental Management
18	Commission, the Coastal Resources Commission, the Sedimentation Control Commission, and
19	any other board or commission charged under the State's statutes with implementation of State
20	or federal environmental law shall, prior to execution, require approval of the General Assembly
21	by majority vote of the Senate and the House of Representatives. The Governor shall transmit
22	any proposed memorandums of agreements of this nature, or modifications to such agreements,
23	to the presiding officers of the Senate and the House of Representatives for confirmation by joint
24	resolution. Implementation of the terms of such agreements shall be prohibited absent
25	confirmation by the General Assembly."
26	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> G.S. 143B-279.4B, as enacted by subsection (a) of this section, shall
27	apply to memorandums of agreement, or modifications to such agreements, proposed for
28	execution on or after the effective date of this act.
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30	DEQ TO INITIATE DISCUSSIONS WITH USEPA TO REVISE MEMORANDUM OF
31	AGREEMENT(S) GOVERNING IMPLEMENTATION OF SEDIMENTATION
32	REQUIREMENTS IN THE STATE
33	<b>SECTION 2.</b> No later than October 1, 2025, the Department of Environmental
34	Quality shall notify the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) of its intent to
35	initiate discussions to revise the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Memorandum
36	of Agreement between the State of North Carolina and USEPA Region 4, and any other
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1 agreement with USEPA, that governs the State's Sedimentation Pollution Control Act of 1973 2 (Act), and its implementation of NPDES General Permit NCG010000 (NCG01) to streamline the 3 regulatory requirements of the Act and NCG01 for the purpose of eliminating program 4 redundancies to minimize (i) unnecessary costs to, and duplication of efforts by, persons 5 initiating land-disturbing activities, (ii) unnecessary delays in project development, and (iii) inefficient use of Department personnel and staff of local governments that administer delegated 6 7 erosion and sedimentation control programs. The Speaker of the House of Representatives and 8 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate may each appoint a person to participate in the 9 discussions, and the Department shall provide notice of and access to all discussions and 10 materials related to the negotiations. The appointees shall report to the Speaker of the House of 11 Representatives and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate on the progress and results of the 12 discussions. The Department shall report to the Environmental Policy Council on the status of 13 their activities pursuant to this section quarterly, beginning January 1, 2026, until such time as 14 the General Assembly repeals this reporting requirement.

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### 16 DEQ TO REQUEST THAT USEPA CONSULT DEQ ON PROPOSED CHANGES TO 17 ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL REGULATIONS PRIOR TO NOTICE OF SAME IN

#### 18 **THE FEDERAL REGISTER**

19 **SECTION 3.** No later than October 1, 2025, the Department of Environmental 20 Quality shall request that the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) consult 21 with the Department on any proposed changes to federal regulations that would impact the State's 22 administration of federal environmental programs in North Carolina, prior to the USEPA's notice 23 of such proposed changes in the Federal Register, so that the State may have opportunity for 24 meaningful collaborative input on development of regulations that it may be charged with 25 administering. The Department shall report to the Environmental Policy Council on the status of 26 their activities pursuant to this section quarterly, beginning January 1, 2026, until such time as 27 the General Assembly repeals this reporting requirement.

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# DEQ TO PROVIDE COPIES OF AGREEMENTS WITH USEPA AND ASSOCIATED FUNDING INFORMATION

31 SECTION 4. No later than October 1, 2025, the Department of Environmental 32 Quality shall submit copies of any agreements executed between the Department and the United 33 States Environmental Protection Agency that govern the State's administration of programs under 34 the Clean Water Act to the House Local Government – Land Use, Planning and Development 35 Committee. In addition, the Department shall provide information to the Committee on:

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- Any federal funds received by the State in connection with the State's administration of such programs, and all federal requirements for receipt of such funds; and
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- (2) The adequacy of funding from all sources to fully implement the requirements of such agreements.
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#### 42 SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

43 **SECTION 5.** If any section or provision of this act is declared unconstitutional or 44 invalid by the courts, it does not affect the validity of this act as a whole or any part other than 45 the part declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

## 4647 EFFECTIVE DATE

48 **SECTION 6.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes 49 law.
