	students cumulatively is not required to comply with the requirements of this section.
	(e) For purposes of teacher privacy, a teacher or staff member may request that the school
	use the teacher's or staff member's personal title and last initial rather than the teacher's or staff
	member's full name when posting materials online to be viewed by the public."
	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> Article 4 of Chapter 116 of the General Statutes is amended by
	adding a new section to read:
	" <u>§ 116-69.3. Inform the public about course materials.</u>
	The Board of Trustees shall ensure that information about course materials is prominently
	displayed on the website of the North Carolina School of the Arts for all elementary, middle, and
	high school programs, in accordance with G.S. 115C-76.75."
	<b>SECTION 1.(c)</b> G.S. 116-235 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
	"(k) Course Materials. – The Board of Trustees shall ensure that information about course
	materials is prominently displayed on the website of the School in accordance with
	<u>G.S. 115C-76.75.</u> "
	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with
	the 2025-2026 school year.
