3	CARE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, TO REQUIRE RENOVATIONS OR NEW BUILDS		
4	OF STATE-OWNED PROPERTY TO INCLUDE A CHILD CARE CENTER OR ADULT		
5	CARE CENTER, TO CREATE A PILOT PROGRAM FOR USE OF STATE-OWNED		
6	PROPERTY FOR CHILD CARE FACILITIES FOR STATE EMPLOYEES, TO CREATE		
7	A PILOT PROGRAM FOR COUNTY GRANTS FOR THIRD-SHIFT CHILD CARE FOR		
8	FIRST RESPONDERS, TO REQUIRE A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR ON-SITE CHILD		
9	CARE AT EACH NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND COLLEGE IN		
10	THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SYSTEM, AND TO ESTABLISH A		
11	WORKGROUP TO EXAMINE STREAMLINING LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS FOR		
12	PHYSICAL STRUCTURES FOR COMMERCIAL CHILD CARE FACILITIES.		
13	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
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15	PART I. USE OF STATE-OWNED PROPERTY FOR CHILD CARE CENTERS FOR		
16	STATE EMPLOYEES		
17	SECTION 1.(a) The Department of Administration shall report to the Joint		
18	Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services and the Joint Legislative		
19	Commission on Governmental Operations, no later than March 31, 2026, on the feasibility and		
20	advisability of using obsolete or underutilized State-owned buildings (available buildings) to		
21	house child care facilities giving child care priority to State employees. The report shall include		
22	the following:		
23	(1) Location of each available building.		
24	(2) Estimated costs for upfitting each property to meet daycare licensing		
25	standards.		
26	(3) Estimated costs for asbestos and lead remediation.		
27	(4) Barriers to the available buildings' use as a child care facility.		
28	SECTION 1.(b) Any project undertaken by the State to build or renovate property		
29	having a budget greater than five million dollars (\$5,000,000) shall include a child care center or		
30	adult day care center if more than 250 people would work in the building. This requirement		
31	includes current projects which have not broken ground by July 1, 2025, unless one or both of		
32	the following exceptions apply:		
33	(1) Inclusion of either type of center would delay the project by six months or		
34 25	more.		
35	(2) Inclusion of either type of center would increase the project cost by ten percent (10%) or more		
36	(10%) or more.		



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2	PART II. CHILD CARE FOR STATE EMPLOYEES
3	SECTION 2.(a) The Division of Child Development and Early Education shall
4	establish a pilot program for onsite child care for State employees as follows:
5	(1) The Division of Child Development and Early Education shall contract with
6	a private commercial child care provider to establish three child care centers
7	for State employees' use to be established on State-owned property that is
8	unused or underutilized.
9	(2) Priority in contracting shall be given to commercial child care providers who
10	currently operate five or fewer facilities and provide high-quality child care.
11	(3) The Division of Child Development and Early Education must include the
12	following terms in the contract with the commercial child care providers:
13	a. The child care facility must operate an apprenticeship program in
14	conjunction with a public or private university or community college
15	who operates an early child care education program.
16	b. The child care center must comply with the requirements established
17	by the Division of Child Development and Early Education for the
18	apprenticeship program.
19	c. The child care center must maintain the operation of the apprenticeship
20	program for so long as the child care center is housed in State-owned
21	property and the university or community college is willing to
22	continue the partnership.
23	d. The State will provide the upfit cost of the space to meet the licensure
24	requirements at reasonable levels that are customary at the operators'
25	other facilities and those similarly situated and provide use of the space
26	rent free, notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 146-29.1.
27	e. The lease terms for State-owned property must be approved as
28	required by G.S. 146-27.
29	SECTION 2.(b) The Division of Child Development and Early Education shall
30	create the requirements for the apprenticeship program and pair the child care centers with a
31	university or community college early education program utilizing parameters similar to the
32	Durham Childcare Apprenticeship Program.
33	SECTION 2.(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
34	Health and Human Services the sum of five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the 2025-2026 fiscal
35	year for the Division of Child Development and Early Education's use in establishing the child
36	care centers as required by Section 2(a) of this act.
37	SECTION 2.(d) If any expenses are incurred by the State for asbestos or lead
38	remediation in establishing the child care centers required by Section 2(a) of this act, the State
39	shall be eligible for reimbursement from the Asbestos and Lead Remediation Fund subject to the
40	rules of the fund for up to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000).
41	SECTION 2.(e) By April 1, 2027, the Division of Child Development and Early
42	Education shall report on and make recommendations to the Joint Legislative Oversight
43	Committee on Health and Human Services, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on
44	General Government, and the Fiscal Research Division the status of the implementation of the
45	pilot program, including successes, concerns, problems encountered, enrollment, and
46	expenditures.
47	SECTION 2.(f) Sections 2(c) and 2(d) of this act are effective July 1, 2025.
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49	PART III. ON-SITE CHILD CARE FOR THIRD-SHIFT FIRST RESPONDERS
50	SECTION 3.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of
51	Health and Human Services the sum of six million dollars (\$6,000,000) for the 2025-2026 fiscal

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1 year for a pilot program to provide counties grants to establish third-shift child care for first 2 responders, with priority to be given to third-shift facilities operated in unused or underutilized 3 county-owned buildings. By April 1, 2027, the Department of Health and Human Services shall 4 report on and make recommendations to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health 5 and Human Services, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government, and 6 the Fiscal Research Division regarding the implementation of the pilot program, including 7 successes, concerns, problems encountered, enrollment, and expenditures. 8 **SECTION 3.(b)** Section 3(a) of this act is effective July 1, 2025. 9 10 PART IV. ON-SITE CHILD CARE AT EACH NORTH CAROLINA COMMUNITY COLLEGE AND COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SYSTEM 11 12 **SECTION 4.1.(a)** Report. – The State Board of Community Colleges shall study 13 and report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Joint Legislative 14 Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services, and the Fiscal Research Division, no later 15 than March 31, 2026, on the feasibility and advisability of implementing a publicly available 16 child care program on every community college campus that offers priority enrollment to the children of community college employees and students. The report shall include the following: 17 18 (1)Recommendations for implementing the child care program. 19 (2)Estimated costs for implementation and maintenance of the child care 20 program. 21 Return on investment of the child care program. (3) 22 (4) Issues related to historical and ongoing utilization of grants or other funding. 23 Barriers to implementation of the child care program. (5) 24 **SECTION 4.1.(b)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Community 25 Colleges System Office the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the study 26 required by Section 4.1(a) of this act. 27 **SECTION 4.1.(c)** Section 4.1(b) of this act is effective July 1, 2025. 28 SECTION 4.2.(a) The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina shall 29 study and report to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Joint Legislative 30 Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services, and the Fiscal Research Division, no later 31 than March 31, 2026, on the feasibility and advisability of implementing a publicly available 32 child care program at each constituent institution campus that offers priority enrollment to the 33 children of university employees and students. The report shall include: 34 Recommendations for implementing the child care program. (1)35 Estimated costs for implementation and maintenance of the child care (2)36 program. 37 (3) Return on investment of the child care program.
