7	eight members appointed by the Governor and General Assembly. Si	x of the members shall be
8	practicing doctors of chiropractic, who are residents of this State and w	ho have actively practiced
9	chiropractic in the State for at least eight consecutive years imr	nediately preceding their
10	appointments; four of these six members shall be appointed by the	Governor, and two by the
11	General Assembly in accordance with G.S. 120-121, one each upon t	he recommendation of the
12	President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of	Representatives. No more
13	than three members of the Board may be graduates of the same coll	llege <u>college, program, o</u>r
14	school of chiropractic. The other two members shall be persons ch

of this section, "direct supervision" means that the supervising licensed chiropractor must be 1 2 within the immediate patient treatment area and available to the student at all times. 3 Each student enrolled in a chiropractic college program that meets the accreditation 4 requirements of G.S. 90-143 may participate in a preceptorship program." 5 **SECTION 1.(d)** G.S. 90-143 reads as rewritten: 6 "§ 90-143. Definitions of chiropractic; examinations; educational requirements. 7 "Chiropractic" is herein defined to be the science of adjusting the cause of disease by (a) 8 realigning the spine, releasing pressure on nerves radiating from the spine to all parts of the body, 9 and allowing the nerves to carry their full quota of health current (nerve energy) from the brain 10 to all parts of the body. It shall be the duty of the North Carolina State Board of Chiropractic Examiners 11 (b) 12 (hereinafter referred to as "Board") to examine for licensure to practice chiropractic in this State 13 any applicant who is or will become, within 60 days of examination, a graduate of a four-year an 14 accredited chiropractic college-program that is either accredited by the Council on Chiropractic Education or deemed by the Board to be the equivalent of such a college program and who 15 furnishes to the Board, in the manner prescribed by the Board, all of the following: 16 17 Satisfactory evidence of good moral character. (1)18 (2)Proof that the applicant has received a baccalaureate degree from a college or 19 university accredited by a regional accreditation body recognized by the 20 United States Department of Education.Education or its international 21 equivalent. 22 (3) A transcript confirming that the applicant has received at least 4,200 hours of 23 accredited chiropractic education. The Board shall not count any hours earned 24 at an institution that was not accredited by the Council on Chiropractic 25 Education or was not, as determined by the Board, the equivalent of such an 26 institution at the time the hours were earned.a doctor of chiropractic degree 27 from an accredited chiropractic program. 28 The examination shall include the following studies: neurology, chemistry, pathology, anatomy, 29 histology, physiology, embryology, dermatology, diagnosis, microscopy, gynecology, hygiene, 30 eye, ear, nose and throat, orthopody, diagnostic radiology, North Carolina jurisprudence, 31 palpation, nerve tracing, chiropractic philosophy, theory, teaching and practice of chiropractic, 32 jurisprudence and any other related studies as the Board may consider necessary to determine an 33 applicant's fitness to practice. The Board may include as part of the examination any examination 34 developed and administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners or its successor 35 organization that the Board considers appropriate, and the examination may be administered by 36 a national testing service. The Board shall set the passing scores for all parts of the examination. 37 " 38 SECTION 1.(e) G.S. 90-146 reads as rewritten: 39 "§ 90-146. Graduates from other states. 40 A graduate of a regular an accredited chiropractic school program who comes into this State 41 from another state may be granted a license by the North Carolina State Board of Chiropractic 42 Examiners as required in this Article." 43 **SECTION 1.(f)** G.S. 90-151 reads as rewritten: 44 "§ 90-151. Extent and limitation of license. 45 Any person obtaining a license from the North Carolina State Board of Chiropractic 46 Examiners shall have the right to practice the science known as chiropractic, in accordance with 47 the method, thought, and practice of chiropractors, as taught in recognized chiropractic schools 48 schools, programs, and colleges, but shall not prescribe for or administer to any person any 49 medicine or drugs, drugs requiring a prescription in accordance with rules and regulations by the 50 United States Food and Drug Administration, nor practice osteopathy or surgery." SECTION 1.(g) G.S. 90-154.3 reads as rewritten: 51

15	SECTION 2. The North Carolina State Board of Chiropractic Examiners may adopt		
16	rules to implement the provisions of this act.		
17	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 2025, and applies to applications		
18	for licensure on or after that date.
