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Senator Smith

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moves to amend the bill on page 243, lines 44-45, by inserting between the lines:

"AGRICULTURE AND RURAL INFRASTRUCTURE

SECTION 10.3.(a) The General Assembly finds the following:

- The General Assembly has a commitment to protect North Carolina's working lands and waters, sustaining rural communities, and strengthening food security.
- (2) By investing in the producers who grow, raise, and harvest our food, the General Assembly is building long-term economic resilience, not for corporations, but for the families and communities who keep this State running.

SECTION 10.3.(b) Notwithstanding any provision of law or of the Committee Report described in Section 45.2 of this act to the contrary, there is appropriated the nonrecurring sum of thirty-five million dollars (\$35,000,000) from the unappropriated balance of the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for the 2025-2026 fiscal year, to be used as follows:

- (1) Ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) to the Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund. These funds shall be prioritized for farms under 200 acres in size and for counties that use agricultural zoning ordinances to protect working lands from non-agricultural development.
- (2) Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the Rural Agricultural Infrastructure Grant Program. These funds shall be used to support cold storage, processing facilities, and regional food distribution systems that enable small and mid-sized farms to reach markets.
- (3) Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for the North Carolina Farm to School Program.
- (4) Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for agricultural workforce development, including apprenticeships and technical training programs in partnership with community colleges and the Cooperative Extensions, focusing on beginning farmers and rural counties experiencing labor shortages.
- (5) Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) for a Working Waterfront Infrastructure Fund to assist licensed commercial fishers and aquaculture operators with
