**SECTION 8A.11.(d)** Notwithstanding any other provision of law or of the Committee Report referenced in Section 45.2 of this act to the contrary, the funds appropriated to the Opportunity Scholarship Grant Fund Reserve for the award of opportunity scholarship grants pursuant to Part 2A of Article 39 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes for the 2025-2026 fiscal year are reduced by the sum of ninety-five million dollars (\$95,000,000) in recurring funds.
