This number reflects the number of applications received during this Fiscal year; however, there may have been applicants pending from the previous year that were issued a license after 07/01/2025.

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There were 94 applications received with conviction records, and 92 licenses granted; with five applications pending Board review. There were no applications denied due to conviction.

10. The U.S. Department of Defense (DOD), as part of an initiative to promote licensure portability for military spouses, in 2021 funded the development of an interstate licensure compact for social workers. The Council of State Governments (CSG) has partnered with the Department of Defense (DoD), the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) and the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) to support the mobility of licensed social workers through the development of a new interstate compact. This additional licensing pathway will facilitate multistate practice among member states and reduce the barriers to license portability. The Board worked with the NC Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers to get SB155 and HB231 the Social Work Licensure

Compact bill passed during the most recent legislative session. North Carolina was the 29th state to adopt the compact legislation.

11. The Rules Review Commission (RRC) recently voted to approve the Board's periodic rule review readoption schedule and the Board is currently undergoing a periodic review of existing rules for 21 NCAC 63.
