# Intellectual & Developmental Disability Services & Supports for Individuals on the Innovations Wait List

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#### **Inclusion Connects**

Inclusion Connects is an initiative that connects people with I/DD to more choices and access to services and supports. It is designed to help people with I/DD, regardless of age or ability level, and their families navigate the complex system of services from birth to the end of life.



Supporting the Direct Support Professional (DSP) Workforce: Addresses workforce shortages and connects DSPs with providers and individuals with I/DD.



Promoting Access to Services: Focuses on providing access to necessary services, including those on the Innovations Waiver Waitlist.



Improving Housing Access: Enhances the housing options available for individuals with I/DD.

#### What is the NC Innovations Waiver?

- The NC Innovations waiver covers a full range of services for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities.
- The NC Innovations waiver is a program that covers home and community-based services for people who need "institutional level of care." Services Include:
  - Community Living & Support
  - Residential Support
  - Day Supports
  - Adaptive Technology & Supplies
  - Vehicle & Home Modifications

- Supported Employment
- Respite
- Benefits Counseling
- Community Networking
- Community Transition

#### 14,736 Total Innovations Waiver Slots Today


2022: 600 new slots

# Other Services for Members on the Innovations Waitlist

- 1915i Option Services (Medicaid Only)
  - -Waiver-like services; much more limited benefit
- Tailored Care Management (Medicaid Only)
- State Funded Services (Non-Medicaid & Medicaid members)
  - -Waiver-like services; very limited benefit

#### 1915(i) Services for Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities

Skills & supports to live in the home



Community Living and Supports provides a trained worker to help with daily activities and life skills.

**Job Coaching** 



**Supported Employment** to find and keep a job that's right for them.

Breaks for caregivers



**Respite** gives caregivers a break, while knowing that their loved one is cared for.

Supports for moving to own home



Community Transition gives up to \$5,000 in credit to help move from an approved setting to their own home.

# **Tailored Care Management**

- Tailored Care Management is a service of specially trained health care workers who know the health care system: a Tailored Care Manager.
- A Tailored Care Manager helps navigate a person's health care including physical, developmental, and mental health by:
  - -Arranging assessment for 1915i Services
  - -Finding doctors who take Medicaid and have openings
  - -Arranging rides to appointments
  - -Helping access services at home and community
  - -Be the main point of contact for all things Medicaid

#### I/DD State Funded Services

- Each LME-MCO receives single stream dollars (state funds) appropriated by the General Assembly for services for people with I/DD who do not have Medicaid.
- State funded services are limited and finite

#### Those services include:

- Community Living and Supports
- Supported Employment
- Respite
- Residential Services




- Tailored Plan Materials
