# overview of the north Carolina judicial branch

The North Carolina Judicial Branch includes about 570 independently elected or appointed judicial officials. These officials are:

- Justices of the Supreme Court
- Judges of the Court of Appeals, District Court, and Superior Court
- District Attorneys
- Clerks of Superior Court

The Judicial Branch has over 7,600 employees located in all 100 counties and 240 facilities across the state.





## Examples of improvements/refinements since pilot go-live

- Batch processing of high-volume criminal forms
- Additional options for court start/end time (previously only AM or PM)
- Expand number of offenses listed on an OFA
- File & Serve case search enhancements for "All Locations"
- Portal users can see "calculated interest as of date" on case financials
- NICS reporting within Enterprise Justice
- Auto-assignment of judges in domestic and juvenile cases at filing ("one judge, one case")





## Examples of improvements/refinements since pilot go-live (continued)

- Auto-assignment of Clerks of Superior Court as judges in probate cases
- District Attorney customized subpoenas
- eDiscovery file size increased to 150GB
- Bond prohibition detail report enhancements
- DSS and DJJ enhanced access to case documents
- Mass enrollment process for law enforcement
- Judgment Search enhancements
- Automated criminal court workflows

- Additional "Elevate Your Expertise" trainings
- Continued configuration of automated workflows ("Process Builder")

#### it budget: overview

- IT Personal Services (\$35.8M)
  - Field Support Staff
  - Network Staff
  - Information Security (Cybersecurity) Staff
- Support Services (\$29.2M)
  - PC/Printer repair
  - Software subscriptions
  - Mainframe
- Telecom/Network (\$22.4M)
  - Network equipment in every facility
  - Phone devices and service provider charges
  - WAN/LAN maintenance
- PC/Printer/Data Processing (\$15.6M)
  - Purchase of PCs/printers/data processing devices (e.g., credit card readers)
  - Maintenance agreements and related equipment (docking stations, monitors, etc.)





#### it budget: cost savings

- Mainframe Retirement
  - Shut down in October 2025 following data migration to Enterprise Justice
  - Phase out of hosting, maintenance, and disaster recovery contractual costs
- Personnel Reductions
  - Phased elimination of mainframe support positions starting in June 2025
  - Some positions repurposed to fill other technology staffing needs
- Asset Management
  - Device refurbishing and redistribution
  - Reallocating underutilized devices and software licenses
  - Identifying and eliminating duplicative or unnecessary services/licenses
- Other Efforts
  - Migrating and consolidating storage to cloud services
  - Resource/project management dashboard





#### it budget: future challenges

- Overall price increases
- Support staff on non-recurring funding
- Windows 11 update
  - Microsoft sunsetting Windows 10 support and updates
  - 8,500 devices statewide require updating to Windows 11
- Device lifecycle replacement
  - 45,000 devices supported statewide
- Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) compliance
  - Federal law requires new web accessibility features by April 2026
  - Requires engaging a vendor to update NC Courts website and content
- Cybersecurity
  - Judicial Branch network defends against 15,000 attacks per day
  - Availability of AI has led to increase in volume and sophistication of attacks







# CRAVE: courtroom audio visual experience


- Enhances capability to hold remote proceedings
- Infrastructure includes cameras, microphones, and monitors
- Allows any Webex supported internet connected device to participate in courtroom hearings virtually from any location
- 222 total systems deployed statewide
- Available in 99 counties
  - Hoke County installation pending courthouse completion
- Counties may purchase additional units through AOC
  - 14 county-purchased systems installed or in progress








# CRAVE system usage by quarter (hours)







unique external participants attending CRAVE








#### new case statistics dashboard

- Displays visualizations of filing, disposition, and pending case data based on user-selected criteria and filters
  - Five-year trends and month-tomonth
  - Filing breakdown by case category
  - Disposition data by disposition type
  - Case aging statistics pending and disposed
- Launched December 2025








#### recovery courts

- NC has 85 courts across 44 counties.
   Many courts serve multiple counties.
- NC has added 31 new courts since January 2021 including 12 new veteran treatment courts.
- Over 8,000 participants in past four years.

#### Safe Babies Court

- Specialty court program seeking to expedite permanence for children aged 0-3.
- Initial pilot launched in July 2024 comprising New Hanover, Mitchell, and Yancey counties.
- Pilot expanded to Avery, Brunswick, Durham, Madison, McDowell, and Rutherford counties.
- Currently serving 95 children among 59 families.
- Early data showing a reduction in time to permanent placement.







#### **Jury Service Improvements**

#### **Juror Payment Cards**

- Replace paper checks mailed via USPS.
- Jurors receive payment the same day after completing service.
- Funds can be transferred to a bank account.

#### **Online Jury Excusal**

- Secure online portal for jurors to submit excusal requests.
- Expedites response time from clerk and chief district court judge's office.
