Share for Cleanup of Sites on the National Priorities List – June 30, 2012

REPORT TO THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS ON EXPENDITURES FROM THE SUPERFUND COST SHARE FUND FOR NORTH CAROLINA'S TEN PERCENT SHARE OF CLEANUPS FOR SITES ON THE NATIONAL PRIORITIES LIST

North Carolina has 37 hazardous waste sites on the National Priorities List (NPL). Fifteen of the NPL sites are fund-financed, where no viable responsible parties have been identified. These sites are being cleaned up using a combination of federal and state public funds. The Hazardous Response Trust Fund (the Superfund) contributes 90 percent of the money for the remedial action and the state contributes the remaining 10 percent.

The state's 10 percent contribution comes from the Superfund Cost Share Fund (SCSF). As of June 30, 2012, the fund had accumulated \$16,564,915 in appropriations, interest and other income. Of that total, \$12,078,064 has been encumbered or disbursed to pay for the state's share of the cleanup costs at the 14 NPL sites with signed Superfund State Contracts (SSCs). Other disbursements and reductions, including operations and maintenance costs, have removed \$1,680,152 from the SCSF, leaving \$2,806,699 available for future cleanup actions and long-term operation and maintenance. Planning for remedial action at two sites, Ore Knob in Ashe County and the Aberdeen Contaminated Groundwater Site in Moore County, is underway and some of the available funding may be obligated for this cleanup in the next few months. An SSC has not been negotiated for Ore Knob or Aberdeen and the Superfund Section has not received firm cost-estimates from USEPA. Other sites may be added to the NPL and could require a 10-percent, state-cost-share match for cleanup.

For Superfund-financed cleanups, the federal Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) section 104(c)(3) requires the state to pay for the long-term operation and maintenance (O&M) of sites after EPA has transferred them to the state. The funds to perform O&M will come from the SCSF. The first site to come under the state's care is the FCX Statesville site. Since the previous report for May 2011, \$7,490 has been used for operation and maintenance at the FCX Statesville site. The total cost for operation and maintenance since the work began in October 2009 is \$28,919. The annual cost estimate is \$15,000 and two sampling events are planned for the site in FY 2013. Active remediation of the site is complete. Effective May 30, 2012, the State Superfund Contract for the remediation of the FCX Statesville Site was terminated. The work was completed under budget. Termination of the contract frees up \$219,359 from the obligated amount of the SCSF (see Table 1). In addition EPA is crediting North Carolina for \$5,346 due to over-match.

Effective Aug. 1, 2012, the state will take over the O&M of the Cape Fear Wood Preserving Site in Cumberland County. The state will be responsible for the O&M of a pump-and-treat facility that removed crossote from the groundwater at the site. The section is attempting to negotiate a contract for operation of the facility with the same contractors that EPA used at Cape Fear. The present estimate for operation of the facility is \$220,000 annually.

Attached Table 1, Fund-Financed NPL Sites, lists the 14 fund-financed sites for which State Superfund Contracts have been signed. The table also shows all encumbrances and disbursements that have occurred due to the state's 10 percent cost share requirement. Note that some sites are divided into operable units (OU). This is common practice in the cleanup of NPL sites, because it makes designing and executing the cleanups more structured and easier to control.

For the months of May and June 2012, two disbursements totaling \$26,590 were made to USEPA from the SCSF. The money was used for cleanup activities underway at the Sigmon's Septic Tank Site in Iredell County and the GMH Electronics Site in Person County. Other than the payments for O&M at the FCX Statesville site discussed above, these were the only disbursements from the SCSF since the last report (May 2012).
