Session Law 2012-382/HB 834 Section 14.1 § 90-413.3A(b)

"...any hospital, as defined in G.S. 131E-76(c), that has an electronic health record system shall connect to the NC HIE [North Carolina Health Information Exchange] and submit individual patient demographic and clinical data on services paid for with Medicaid funds."



Session Law 2013-363/HB 112

Section 4.18 modifies the language of SL 2013-382 above to add, "The NC HIE shall give the Department of Health and Human Services real-time access to data and information contained in the NC HIE" and replaces a specific effective date in SL 2013-392 (Jan.y 1, 2014) with two conditions that must be satisfied before the law becomes effective:

- (1) The Department of Health and Human Services and the NC HIE shall execute an agreement regarding the utilization and sharing of data and information contained in the HIE Network, which shall be in a manner that complies with the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act of 1996, P.L. 104-191, as amended (HIPAA), the rules adopted under HIPAA, and any other applicable federal laws.
- (2) The Department of Health and Human Services and the NC HIE shall jointly submit a report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committees on Information Technology and Health and Human Services on the agreement described in subdivision (1) of this subsection.
