

### **Blue Ridge Community College NC Back-to-Work Program Overview**

About NC Back-to-Work (BTW) Program at Blue Ridge Community College: The state-funded program focuses on providing job training and retraining, employability skills, and nationally-recognized credentials to the long-term unemployed and veterans in Henderson and Transylvania Counties

About our Service Area: Blue Ridge Community College serves Henderson and Transylvania Counties in Western North Carolina. The unemployment rate for January 2014 was 5.3% and 7.7%, respectively. Based on the NC Department of Commerce Tier System, Henderson County is Tier III and Transylvania County is Tier II.

**Program Funding:** Year One (2012-2013) \$363,359; Year Two (2013-2014) \$120,000

**Program Offerings:** Year One program offerings included automotive, manufacturing, food/beverage, and computer systems. Year Two program offerings were advanced manufacturing, transportation systems, computer systems, and brewing technology.

#### **Program Successes:**

- An advisory group of local employers and workforce organizations provided input on program offerings to ensure a direct tie to local workforce needs.
- Currently, 42 of the 48 (88%) participants who received BTW scholarships in Year One are employed. All were previously considered long-term unemployed in 2013.
- Eight veterans received NC Back-to-Work scholarships in Year Two for job training.
- Seven current faculty members received industry-specific training in order to prepare students for thirdparty credentials. In Year One, the 48 BTW scholarship recipients received 77 third-party credentials.
- Most BTW courses were designed to articulate with curriculum (credit) offerings.
- Broad range marketing efforts used to reach target audiences, such as direct mail to veterans, were effective in building a successful program.
- All intake for the program is done through NCWorks Career Centers on Blue Ridge Community College campuses, allowing participants to take advantage of career counseling, employability lab, and other free resources. All participants will earn a NC Career Readiness Certificate to use as proof of workplace skills.
