- Grant and loan programs:
 efficiently and cost-effectively distribute of tax dollars.
- Cash balances: cover commitments with modest operating reserve.
- Board size: provides professional oversight of broad activities for \$18,000 annually.
- Relationship with Commerce: covers the spectrum of life-science company needs.
